# Act tough even before ruling

HC spurs govt on deadly agitation; details of directives come out; today's SSC tests on Friday

Amid the mindless violence that has already killed at least 71 people and disrupted education and businesses, the High Court has asked the government to take all necessary steps to prevent deadly blockade and hartal.

"Pending hearing of the Rule, let the State functionary ... be directed to take all necessary measures to prevent the unconstitu-

tional deadly oborodh [blockade] and equally deadly and fierce, compulsive, coercive, homicidal and threatful hartal," the HC said in an interim order on two petitions pending before it.

In response to the petitions, the HC had on Sunday issued a rule upon the government and the leaders of the BNP-led 20-party alliance, including BNP chief Khaleda

# Democracy for the dead?

At least 71 people have been killed so far with many of them burnt alive in arson attacks. The economy continues to bleed and academic life of students is in peril.

All this is happening in the name of agitation that the BNP termed a movement for "restoring people's democratic and voting rights."

The crucial question is: can the right to personal life and liberty be sacrificed for the sake of any other democratic or voting rights?

Analysing fundamental rights in his book Constitutional Law of Bangladesh, eminent jurist Mahmudul Islam writes, "No right is so basic and fundamental as the right to personal life and liberty, and exercise of all other rights is dependent on the right to personal life and liberty."

# 2 more killed in 'shootouts'

A Jamaat activist, the prime accused of the February 6 Gaibandha bus arson, was killed in a "shootout" with the Rab in the district yesterday morning.

Another "shootout" left an "outlawed party leader" dead in Jhenidah earlier in the day.

The Jamaat man was identified as Mostafa Manjil, 32, a former president of Gaibandha Sadar unit Islami Chhatra Shibir, the student wing of the party.

Alleging that the Rab cooked up a story after killing him, the district unit Jamaat in protest called a 48-hour hartal beginning 6:00am today.

Another victim was Rafique Uddin alias Chhoto Tareque, 40, resident of a cluster village in Bishoykhali Bazar under Jhenidah Sadar upazila.

# Common people left in miseries

*Violence on; another arson victim dies*

Abdul Matin sells caps and books at a roadside shop in the city's Tejturibazar area. His daily sale before the blockade was around Tk 1,000, which drastically dropped to Tk 400 now.

He lives in a rented house of two rooms at Tejturibazar. To earn some extra bucks, he rented out one of the rooms where six people can stay, like in a student's mess. But only three people have been staying there since the blockade began on January 6.

"Very few people are coming to Dhaka nowadays due to the blockade and hartal," said Matin, who hails from Comilla.


