

## Boy held for raping speech-impaired girl

Police arrested a teenage boy in Kishoreganj upazila of the district on Sunday on charge of violating a speech-impaired girl the day before.

The arrestee is Mostakim, 16, son of Oliur Rahman of Bhondapara village in the upazila.

Police and locals said Mostakim entered Oliur's house at the village at noon when his 15-year-old girl was alone. He took the girl to a nearby mustard field, raped her and left the scene.

Hearing screams, local people rushed to the spot, rescued the girl and sent her to the upazila health complex.

Victim's father filed a rape case with Kishoreganj Police Station the same day, accusing Mostakim.

Police arrested Mostakim on Sunday. He was yesterday produced in a court that sent him to jail.

## Robber killed in mob beating

An alleged robber was killed in a mob beating in Chandicherra Tea Garden area under Chunarughat upazila of Habiganj district early yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Md Kutub Ali, 50, of Osmanpur village in the upazila. Police said a gang of robbers entered the house of one Gunjan Goala at around 3:00am.

As the family members cried for help, locals rushed to the spot and caught Kutub. His accomplices managed to flee the scene.

They beat up Kutub mercilessly, leaving him dead on the spot, said Amulya Kumar Chowdhury, officer-in-charge of Chunarughat Police Station.

## 84 Indian mobile phone sets seized, 2 held

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) arrested two siblings along with 84 Indian mobile phone sets at a bazaar in Shibganj upazila town yesterday.

The arrestees are Ranaul Islam, 30, and his brother Mohammad Shakil, 28, of Daulatpur area in the upazila.

On secret information, the border guards raided Shibganj Bazar and seized the mobile phone sets from Maa Telecom, a mobile phone shop owned by Ranaul.

They later arrested the two from the shop, said Lt Col Abu Zafar Sheikh Mohammad Bazul Haque, commanding officer of BGB-9 Battalion.

The two brothers were later handed over to Shibganj Police Station, said the BGB official.

## Tourist police start working in Kuakata

A team of tourist police started functioning in Kuakata sea beach area of Kalapara upazila under the district on Sunday, much to the happiness of the stakeholders at the picturesque tourist spot.

The 34-member team comprising Inspector Shahjahan Dewan Monir (functioning as officer in charge), three sub inspectors, nine assistant sub inspectors and 22 constables has been stationed at Ananda Bari, a hired guest-house in Kuakata.

The team members

brought out a procession that paraded the main roads in Kuakata municipality area yesterday noon.

The number of the policemen there will be increased and an additional superintendent of police will monitor the activities of the team, said Inspector Shahjahan Dewan Monir.

Rumman Imtiaz Tushar, a development worker in the area, also expressed satisfaction over the arrangement.

On February 25 in 2012, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at a public meeting at Mojahar Biswas College ground in Kalapara upazila town had announced arranging tourist police in Kuakata.

## 25 injured in clash over land dispute

At least 25 people were injured in a clash between two rival groups over a land dispute at Radhapur village in Nabiganj upazila of Habiganj district yesterday.

Locals said there had been a long-standing dispute between Abdur Rahim and Nurul Islam of the village over a piece of land.

Rahim and Nurul locked in an altercation over the issue in the morning. Hearing the news, the supporters of the two, equipped with lethal weapons, rushed in and swooped on each other, leaving at least 25 people from both sides injured.

Of the injured, eight were admitted to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital while the rest to Nabiganj Upazila Health Complex and Habiganj Sadar Hospital.

## Father, son punished for selling liquor

A mobile court here yesterday sentenced a man to one month's imprisonment while his son to four months for selling locally made liquor illegally in Pirgachha upazila of the district.

The convicts are Abdul Jabbar, 50, and his son Dul Mia, 22, of Darjipara village in the upazila.

Aminul Islam, officer in charge of Pirgachha Police Station, said a police team, acting on a tip-off, raided Jabbar's house at noon and seized 10 litres of locally made liquor. The law enforcers also arrested Jabbar and his son.

Police produced the duo before the court. After a hearing, Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) and Executive Magistrate Aleya Ferdous Jahan punished them.

## Landslide at Sylhet stone quarry kills 4 workers

Four workers were killed in a landslide at the country's biggest stone quarry at Bholaganj in Companyganj upazila of the district on Sunday night.

The deceased were identified as Moin Uddin, 40, son of Etim Hossain, Dana Mia,

42, son of Anwar Hossain, Delwar, 24, son of Shahjalal, and Emdadul Haque Selim, 42, son of Siddik Ali of Kathalbari village in the upazila.

Officer-in-Charge Delwar Hossain of Companyganj Police Station said the incident

took place when the workers were extracting stones from the quarry at around 9:00pm.

On information, law enforcers led by Sub-Inspector Akram Hossain went to the spot and recovered the bodies with the help of locals.

## Two stalkers jailed, four others arrested

A mobile court jailed two youths for stalking a madrasa girl in Dinajpur district while police arrested four people on charge of stalking two schoolgirls in Jamalpur town on Sunday.

The convicts are second year student of Joypurhat Government College Sohail Rana, 20, son of Delwar Hossain of Bijul-Kanchigari village in in Birampur upazila of Dinajpur and Ahed Ali, 25, a car driver of the upazila, reports our correspondent.

Sohail was sentenced to six months' imprisonment

and Ahed Ali to three months in prison.

Police said Sohail along with Ahed Ali in a car came to Bijul Madrasa area in the afternoon and started teasing the girl. At this, locals caught the duo and handed them over to police.

They were later produced before a court, led by Executive Magistrate SM Moniruzzaman, which punished them, said Golam Rabbani, sub-inspector of Birampur Police Station.

Away in Jamalpur, police arrested four people in the district town on Sunday on charge of teasing two

schoolgirls, reports our correspondent.

The arrestees are Jamsher Ali, 21, son of Abdur Rahman, Milon, 20, son of Abdur Rahman, Rabin Islam, 15, son of Shahin Islam of Muslimabad area, and Nayan, 15, son of Momin Miah of Kacharipara area in the town.

Police said the four used to tease the girls on the way to their school.

On Sunday night, local people caught them when they were stalking the girls on way to their home from a coaching centre. They were later handed over to Sadar police.

## Fire kills 1500 poultry birds in Nilphamari

### 11 shops, 2 govt offices gutted in Habiganj

Fire killed around 1500 poultry birds at Andharur More village in Domar upazila of Nilphamari district early yesterday.

Fire service sources said the fire originated from an electric short circuit at the farm owned by Farid Hossain of the village around 4:00am, killing at least 15,000 chickens.

A fire fighting unit from Domar Fire Service Station rushed to the spot and doused the flames around 6:00am, said Bhabendra Nath, an official of the station.

Farid Hossain said he started poultry business a year ago, taking loan from a

non-governmental organisation (NGO). He claimed that the extent of damage caused by the fire would be around Tk 5 lakh.

Our Moulvibazar correspondent adds: At least 11 shops and two government offices were gutted in fire incidents in Sadar and Baniarchang upazilas of Habiganj district on Sunday.

In Sadar upazila, at least 11 shops were destroyed by a fire in Chowdhury Bazar around 10:00pm.

Nazim Uddin, officer in charge of Sadar Police Station, told this correspondent over cellphone that the fire originated from an electric short circuit at a cloth store and soon spread to 10 other adjacent shops.

Being informed, a fire

fighting unit from the district headquarters went to the bazaar and extinguished the blaze. The affected shop owners claimed that the damages caused by the fire could go up to Tk 50 lakh.

In Baniarchang, two government offices at the upazila headquarters were gutted in a fire around 7:30pm.

Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Shamsul Islam said the fire originated from an electric short circuit and engulfed the upazila offices of the Women Affairs Department and Islamic Foundation.

Informed by locals, fire fighters went to the spot and brought the blaze under control around 8:30pm, the UNO added.

## Child marriage bid foiled

A mobile court foiled a bid for child marriage in Bhaluka upazila headquarters of the district on Sunday night.

Police said seventh grader Shadida Akhtar, 12, daughter of Nurul Islam of

the area, was set to be married with Ashraf Uddin, 18, son of Afaz Uddin of Satenga in the upazila.

On information, the court, led by Executive Magistrate Tarafder Sohel Rahman, rushed to the spot at around 10:00pm and stopped the marriage.

The bride, bridegroom

and the matchmaker Shariful Islam were also arrested. However, the parents of Shadida and Ashraf managed to flee the scene.

The court later fined the bride Tk 1,000 and jailed the bridegroom and matchmaker for 20 and 10 days respectively.

## Freedom fighter burnt alive

A paralysed freedom fighter (FF) was burnt alive as a fire gutted his house at Jhanka village in Muktagachha upazila of the district on Sunday night.

The dead was identified as Abdus Sabur, 70, a retired army man.

Police and fire brigade sources said the fire originated from a lamp kept at the house at around 10:00pm on Sunday.

Sabur was alone at his house and burnt to death, said Kamal Hossain, officer-in-charge of Muktagachha Police Station.
