CANNAVARO JAILED

Fabio Cannavaro has been sentenced to 10 months in prison for breaching orders to keep out of his property after it was seized by authorities. The 41-year-old, who played for Parma, Internazionale, Juventus and Real Madrid, and captained Italy to their 2006 World Cup triumph, has been under investigation for tax evasion. In October, authorities in Naples seized almost €1m of goods linked to Cannavaro and his wife. However, his failure to adhere to their ruling last month has led to Cannavaro being handed a 10-month sentence. - INTERNET



'FIFA must compensate' AFP, Berlin

German Football League (DFL) president Reinhard Rauball has criticised FIFA for insisting they will not compensate European clubs despite proposals to hold the 2022 World Cup in November and December.

Plans to play the 2022 tournament in Qatar in the middle of the European season have still to be ratified next month by FIFA's executive committee, but the proposal has met widespread condemnation in Germany.

The FIFA proposal is based on common sense due to extreme temperatures in the Middle East state during June and July, when World Cup finals are traditionally held, but the date switch would cause major disruption to European competitions.

On Tuesday, Karl-Heinz Rummenigge, said he expected FIFA to compensate Europe's leagues and clubs for losing their top players at a key stage of the season, but FIFA general secretary Jerome Valcke has said there will be "no financial compensation given".

Sheikh Russel cruise past Ctg Abahani

2-0 win over Chittagong Abahani in the third quarterfinal at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Nigerian Kingsley Chigozie gave the 2012-13 season's treble winners a 41minute lead before Cameroonian forward Paul Emile doubled the lead on 56 minutes Sheikh Russel a deserved lead in the 41st to confirm the last-four berth after a one- minute, this time he again chested down year gap.

Having shrugged off their poor performance in the previous match, Sheikh Russel put up a better display over their opponents from the port city but the Blues still were lacking combination in midfielder, thanks to the absence of injured playmakers Hemanta Vincent Biswas and Zahid Hossain.

Chittagong Abahani, who came into the quarterfinals after holding giants Abahani to a goalless draw, looked good in quick attacks but they could hardly unsettle the backline of Sheikh Russel except the one in which Chittagong Abahani could have

taken a lead in the first half.

Khaled Ahmed worked hard from the right side to dart into the box before releasing a nice low ball for Guinean Mamadou Lamaranna for a tap-in which he missed.

Nigerian Kingsley Chigozie nicely chested down a Zahid Hasan Emily cross before firing a brilliant side-volley only to be denied by the crosspiece on 25 minutes before Yousuf Sifat's shot unbelievably floated over the crosspiece inside the sixyard box on the half-hour mark.

Kingsley soon made amends to give another Emily cross and placed the ball over goalkeeper Mohammedan Selim.

After resumption, Sheikh Russel looked more organized to enjoy the lion's share of ball possession and thus doubled the lead with an eye-catching strike from Paul Emile, who suddenly drove a dipping shot from 30 yards to give Abahani goalkeeper no chance to react in the 56th minute.

The margin could have been widened but Emily flicked a Sohel Rana cross off the crosspiece inside the six-yard box and Sheikh Russel were content with a comfortable win before facing star-studded Sheikh Jamal DC in the first semifinal on Sunday.

Halilhodzic set for Japan

Japanese football officials were tightlipped Thursday as Algeria's 2014 World Cup coach Vahid Halilhodzic emerged as the leading candidate for the vacant national team job, according to local media.

The Japan Football Association (JFA) were said to be in talks with the 62year-old Bosnian, broadcaster NHK reported, while the Nikkan Sports newspaper claimed that Halilhodzic had been offered an estimated salary of 2 million euros (\$2.27 million) to replace Mexican Javier Aguirre, who was sacked earlier this month.

But a JFA spokeswoman told AFP: "No formal decision had been made and as such we are not in a position to make any comment on the issue."

The JFA's silence comes as little surprise after the fiasco surrounding Aguirre, who was fired over his alleged involvement in a match-fixing scandal dating back to a previous tenure in Spain, having taken charge only after Japan's World Cup flop last year.




