ARSON ATTACKS GO ON

14 vehicles torched; 5 suffer burns

Five people, including a reporter of Ekattor TV, received burn injuries in arson attacks in Dhaka and Joypurhat yesterday.

At least 14 vehicles were torched across the country yesterday, according to fire service officials. Eight of them were in Dhaka.

Ekattor TV reporter Arefin Shakil, 24, and three others were wounded when criminals set fire to a bus in Rampura around 8:15pm yesterday.

The other injured were Rabina Karim Tumpa, 18, a first-year student of management, Hafiza Shikder Kuntala, 24, a law graduate, and Nazimuddin, 18, a mason.

Ekattor TV's Arefin said he along with his two relatives -- Tumpa and Kuntala -got on the bus which had about 8-10 passengers.

"As soon as the bus left Rampura stop, I heard a loud bang and saw fire all around me," said Arefin. Three percent of his and Nazimuddin's body were burnt.

About 18 percent of Tumpa's body, including her face, was burnt while Kuntala had 10 percent of her body burnt. SEE PAGE 8 COL 2

LOSS DUE TO HARTAL, BLOCKADE

Businesses go to HC for remedy

Four leading business bodies yesterday filed a writ petition with the High Court seeking its direction on the government to impose reasonable restrictions on hartals and blockade in an attempt to save business from financial loss.

Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry, Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association, Bangladesh Textiles Manufacturers and Exporters Association and Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exporters Association collectively submitted the petition.

In the petition, they requested to the HC to order the government and political parties to compensate for the losses incurred, petitioners' lawyer Imtiaz Moinul Islam told The Daily Star.

They said the government could compensate by extending the duration of loan payment to 12 years as their business activities were being greatly hampered.

Businesses concerned usually repay their loans in three to four years.

The CCTV images show the three girls entering a bus terminal in Istanbul's Bayrampasa district on the European side of the city, which the trio reached by metro from the airport.




