### Ramsey set for return

Arsenal midfielder Aaron Ramsey is in line to make his return from a hamstring problem in Wednesday's Premier League clash with Queens Park Rangers, manager Arsene Wenger revealed on Tuesday.

The Wales international sustained a third hamstring injury of the season during Arsenal's 2-1 defeat of Leicester City on February 10, but is in contention to feature at Loftus Road after returning to training ahead of schedule.

"Aaron Ramsey is back in the squad," Wenger told a press conference.

"When you have a repetition of muscular injuries, it can put the handbrake on your body a little bit. To get rid of that is a psychological problem.

"I don't think he suffers from that, looking at him in training. Certainly, you lose a bit of confidence in your body."

## AFC U-23 C'SHIP QUALIFIERS Camp likely from March 16

The training camp for the U-23 national football team ahead of the AFC U-23 Championship Qualifiers is likely to get underway from March 16, just 10 days before the start of the four-team qualifiers to be held in Dhaka.

The Bangladesh Football Federation is planning to suspend the Bangladesh Premier League, which is scheduled to start from March 9 for two weeks to accommodate the training camp of the U-23 national team as well as the qualifiers which will feature Bangladesh, Uzbekistan, Syria and India from March 27 to 31.

"We are thinking of suspending the Bangladesh Premier League after the completion of the first two rounds matches which will be completed on March 15. The U-23 team will start its training either at BKSP or at the BNS," said BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag adding that they have already asked Dutch coach Lodewijk de Kruif to arrive in Bangladesh by March 12.

Saiful Bari Titu, assistant coach of the national team, informed that they might call up 28 to 30 players for the camp including the current senior national players who are eligible to play for the U-23 team.

The former Bangladesh international said that he has identified some young talents like winger Rabbi of Brothers Union, striker Afsar of Rahmatganj, left-back Faisal and midfielder Jony of Mohammedan during the ongoing Federation Cup, but would call up players as per de Kruif's advice and those who had been in camp previously under de Kruif, would get priority.

## Keita denies Juve



Seydou Keita salvaged a share of the points for 10man Roma in a 1-1 draw with Juventus that saw the champions retain their ninepoint lead at the top of Serie

A on Monday.

Carlos Tevez curled a free-kick over a Roma wall for his 15th goal of the season that took him top of the Serie A scoring charts. But the veteran Keita equalised in the 78th minute to secure a club record sixth straight home draw.

Roma welcomed the Bianconeri to the Stadio Olimpico desperate for the win that would maintain their unlikely title challenge. Rudi Garcia's men had drawn six of their

last seven league games but had never drawn six times consecutively at home, until Monday. Under the circumstances, Roma -- who

have been ravaged by injuries to key players and only recently welcomed back Ivorian striker Gervinho from the Africa Cup of Nations -- would be happy with a point.

However Juventus remain unbeaten against Roma this season and with a ninepoint advantage look to have one hand on

what would be a fourth consecutive title. Roma started with influential midfielders Radja Nainggolan and Juan Iturbe on the bench while Juventus were without Andrea Pirlo and Paul Pogba -- two

of their most creative players -- as they sought to make it two wins from two over the Giallorossi following a bad-tempered 3-2 win in Turin early in the campaign.

After an insipid first half without clearcut chances, the hosts suffered a blow just after the hour when Vasilis Torosidis saw red for a second bookable offence.

In the absence of free kick specialist Pirlo, who is out for three weeks with a calf injury, Tevez stepped up and delivered in style, shooting over the defensive wall with Morgan De Sanctis rooted to the spot.

Tevez almost had his second minutes later but Kostas Manolas's boot blocked after the Argentinian unleashed a halfvolley to the right of goal.

Despite their disadvantage, Roma pressed for the equaliser and almost found the breakthrough when Claudio Marchisio caught the heel of Miralem Pjanic on the left flank.

Alessandro Florenzi, who came on for Adem Ljajic just after Torosidis's sendingoff, crossed the ball to Manolas whose glancing header forced Gianluigi Buffon to tip the ball to safety down low.

Roma's insistence finally paid off.

Iturbe won a free kick to the right of the area after a solid challenge from Giorgio Chiellini. The Colombian's free kick found Keita at the back post and the Malian's header bounced over the line past the foot of Marchisio.

# Duo failing to live up to price tags

Juan Mata and Angel Di Maria are the two most expensive players in Manchester United's history, costing a combined

97 million pounds (\$150 million) last year as the club looked to regain their status as England's top team.

Mata, bought for 37.1 million pounds (\$57 million) by David Moyes, has mainly been used as a substitute by new manager Louis van Gaal this season despite a decent scoring record when he has started for United. A World Cup and European Championship winner with Spain and twice Chelsea's player of the year, the playmaker is a forgotten man at Old Trafford these days.

Di Maria took over from Mata as United's costliest player when he was signed from Real Madrid for 59.7 million pounds (\$92 million), but his form has dipped after an encouraging start.

Van Gaal hasn't found the best position for the Argentina midfielder, who admitted before the 2-0 win over Sunderland on Saturday that he was still in the "settling-in

process" in English football. Di Maria was poor by his high standards against Sunderland and was substituted at halftime -- quite a fall from grace for a player who was man of the match in last season's Champions League final.

"I cannot deny what I see and we have to give Angel a little bit more time to adapt to the Premier League," Van Gaal said.

"The rhythm of the game is so high here, much higher than in other countries. He has to adapt to the culture and we have to give him time to adapt and also to lift his confidence again."

With Adnan Januzaj impressing as Di Maria's replacement against Sunderland, the Argentine may even find himself on the bench at Newcastle as Man United look to keep their place in the Champions League qualification places.

United's fight with Arsenal and Jong possibly sidelined for Liverpool for third and fourth place looks set to go to the wire this season, with the three clubs separated by two points. It could be more exciting than the title race, as Chelsea have a five-point lead -- and a game in hand -- over second-place Manchester City heading into the full midweek program in the league.

#### Twin blow for Milan

AC Milan midfielders Riccardo Montolivo and Nigel De Jong are set to miss the embattled Serie A club's upcoming games after being sidelined by injury during a scoreless draw away to Chievo on Saturday.

Italy international Montolivo has "suffered a hamstring problem" while Dutchman De Jong "suffered a muscle injury in the back of his thigh", according to a club statement.

It added that club captain "Montolivo (...) will undergo further medical tests in a week's time" while the fitness of De Jong "will be re-assessed

in around 10 days' time". Reports in Italy suggest Montolivo will be out for around two weeks with De

up to a month. Milan have won only twice in their past 10 league games, a run which has left the seven-

time European champions languishing in 10th place, 23 points behind leaders and champions Juventus.

## Chelsea aim to extend lead

Having claimed the season's first major trophy, Chelsea will attempt to tighten their stranglehold on the

Premier League title race when they visit West Ham United in mid-week.

Chelsea beat Tottenham Hotspur 2-0 at Wembley on Sunday to lift the League Cup and they were given double cause for celebration by Manchester City's 2-1 defeat at Liverpool earlier in the day.

Chelsea now lead second-place City by five points with a game in hand, leaving manager Jose Mourinho well placed to repeat the feat from his first season at the club, 10 years ago, when his side followed up success in the League Cup by romping to the title by a

12-point margin.

But Mourinho, who had gone two and a half years without winning a trophy, said that it was too early to declare the title race over, and pointed to the form of Manchester United and a resurgent Liverpool as proof.

"It's in the hands of everyone," he

said. "We have lots of difficult matches to play. City have difficult matches. United are third (actually fourth), right? They are in the title race, too.



South Africa's total was the second highest total in World Cup history, just two runs behind India's record 413 for five against Bermuda in 2007. It was the second successive 400-plus total for the Proteas

against the West Indies in Sydney last week. The Irish were reduced to 21 for three by the fifth over and slipped to 48 for five by the 11th before Andy Balbirnie (58) and Kevin O'Brien (48) led a late revival by adding 81 for the sixth wicket.
