Jamaat man hurt in police firing in Rajshahi

An arrested Jamaat man sustained bullet injuries as law enforcers opened fire on the party activists during a drive in Kapasia area of Rajshahi city yesterday morning, said police.

With left leg injuries, Nurul Islam, 45, the Jamaat man, was admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, Abdur Rouf, officer-in-charge of Motihar Police Station, told reporters in the afternoon.

Nurul, an accused in seven cases filed for subversive activities in the city, was arrested in Kobirajpara on Friday noon.

As police was taking him to Kapasia to arrest his cohorts, some of his associates exploded bombs and tried to snatch him from the law enforcers, said the OC.

In response, police opened fire on them and Nurul was shot as he tried to flee, he added.

Girl meets tragic death as bus hits rickshaw in capital

6 others killed in three dists CITY DESK

A two-and-a-half-year-old girl was thrown off her mother's lap and died after a bus hit a rickshaw carrying them near Fulbaria bus terminal in the capital last

Arshi was declared dead at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

She and her mother Nurunnahar, 30, were returning home in Wari from Savar, said Bangshal police, quoting Nurunahar's husband Md Ujjal.

Police detained the driver and seized the bus. Meanwhile, six other people were killed and five injured in road accidents across three districts yesterday.

In Bogra, four people died and four others were injured when a truck hit some pedestrians and rammed into

a fruit shop at Baghopara. All of the deceased, Afroza Begum, 22, her son Nur Mohammad, 04, Naya Mia, 50, and Ahmed Ali, 70, were inhabitants of the area.

In Moulvibazar, Siraj Miah, 66, of Balissor village, died when an autorickshaw hit him while he was crossing the road in Taltola bridge area of

Kulaura upazila. In Chittagong city, Riya Akhter Jui, 5, daughter of Md Mohiuddin of Dakkhin-Madyam Halishahar, died and her grandmother was injured after a vehicle hit the rickshaw carrying them in

Speaking as chief guest, eminent rights activist Sultana Kamal said women are still deprived of their rights and respects even

though they are playing a significant role in the country's economic progress.

Males will have to be sensitised to the rights of women, she viewed.

Manusher Jonno Foundation Executive Director Shaheen Anam said women are not safe even at home. So, the practice of paying respect to women should be initiated in the family.

NHRC Honorary Member Nirupa Dewan said coordinated efforts from both males and females are crucial for protecting women's rights.

Bangladesh Mahila Parishad Acting General Secretary Rakhi Das Purkayastha said political use of religion and rise of fundamentalism are the challenges for women empowerment.

NHRC Chairman Mizanur Rahman and its Full Time Member Kazi Reazul Hoque spoke at the event which was attended by around a dozen of rights activists.

Abdus Samad Pintu, who is now in jail for his suspected involvement in the murder. Earlier, members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested a few more

suspects, including Pintu and a former Jubo Dal leader, in connection with the killing. On November 15, last year, Shafiul Islam, a teacher of sociology department,

was stabbed by some assailants on his way home at Chouddapai near the university campus. He succumbed to his

injures at Rajshahi Medical College and Hospital half an hour later.

overcome. "Killing people through firebombs as well as in the name of crossfire, abductions and forced disappearances are both sick politics," the eminent jurist told a meeting with the

party's city unit at its Arambagh central office in the capital. Dr Kamal said Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman showed the path towards fair politics and freedom and gave the people an independent country and a constitution, according

to which people were the country's supreme owners. On the upcoming elections to Dhaka north and south city corporations, he questioned how prospective candidates were able to start campaigning through billboards, posters and banners even before the election schedule's announcement.

"From where did they get that money?... What kind of politics is this?...Why is the Election Commission remaining silent? Why are they not taking action?" questioned Dr Kamal, adding that it was totally illegal and void of electoral rules.

BR west zone getting Tk 7,902cr upgrade

BSS, Rajshahi

The west zone of Bangladesh Railway (BR) is implementing eight major projects involving around Tk 7,902.02 crore to improve railway tracks and other infrastructures to facilitate more passengers and businessmen.

Works on three projects have already been completed by spending around Tk 508.34 crore, thereby 95-kilometre Lalmonirhat-Burimari, 52-kilometre Syedpur-Chilahati and 85-kilometre Amnura-Rohanpur sections along with 80 bridges and 25 stations situated there have been renovated.

Mahbubul Haque Bakshi, chief engineer of the zone, told the BSS that the zone is implementing two projects of constructing rail lines at an estimated cost of Tk 2,537.36 crore.

At present, the zone, covering Rajshahi, Rangpur and Khulna divisions, has 141 trains, including 50 intercity trains, which are operating on different routes including Dhaka. Eight commuter or shuttle trains are operating on various short routes which are very popular among passengers.

Besides the construction of a 141-kilometre new line, the existing 85-kilometre rail line is being rehabilitated under the projects in Rajbari, Faridpur, Gopalganj, Natore and Pabna districts.
