Govt opts for uniform VAT rate

The government yesterday decided to impose a universal value-added tax rate of 15 percent in all areas, instead of multiple rates, though the business community has long been opposing the idea of a uniform rate.

"I had thought multiple (VAT) rates would be better, but after listening to all kinds of arguments, I have changed my mind," Finance Minister AMA Muhith told reporters after a meeting with a visiting mission of the International Monetary Fund at his secretariat.

The minister said he had a long discussion with the IMF team on whether the VAT rate would be multiple or universal. The VAT law with a 15 percent universal rate was earlier

scheduled to come into effect from July this year, but in the face of opposition from businesses, the government last year backtracked on the plan.

As a result, the sixth instalment of an IMF loan package, which was supposed to be released in November, was deferred.

As a consensus was reached with the IMF yesterday, the finance minister said, "The loan that was stuck will be cleared now."

The next two instalments -- around \$280 million in total - of the loans under the lender's Extended Credit Facility programme will be released by June, he said.


