Discarded striker Danny Welbeck returned to demolish Manchester United's hopes of silverware by netting the winner in Arsenal's 2-1 FA Cup quarterfinal victory at Old Trafford on Monday.

England international Welbeck, who joined the Londoners in September after his United career stalled, pounced on a horrendous back pass by Antonio Valencia in the 61st minute to send the holders through.

In a rip-roaring first half Nacho Monreal's cool finish put Arsenal ahead in the 26th minute but Wayne Rooney's diving header evened it up three minutes later.

United, who will now ponder a second consecutive season without a trophy in the wake of manager Alex Ferguson's retirement, ended the match with 10 men after Angel Di Maria was red-carded for grabbing the referee's shirt just seconds after being booked for diving.

Welbeck had managed only two goals for Arsenal since October and was not having much joy on his first return to Old Trafford since his 16 they must win a replay against Blackburn million pounds (24.20 million) switch.

# Chelsea buzzing

Chelsea are brimming with confidence and, fortified by a seven-day break, go into Wednesday's Champions League last-16 return match as favourites to knock Paris St

Germain out for the second season in a row. Defender Gary Cahill says "there's a great

buzz" around Stamford Bridge after the Londoners followed their 2-0 League Cup final victory over Tottenham Hotspur on March 1 by winning 1-0 at West Ham United in the Premier League three days later. Treble-chasing Chelsea, who are five

points clear at the top of the Premier League, have not played since their Upton Park triumph and, according to Cahill, the Wembley win over Spurs has lifted the squad's self-belief to new heights. "The Cup final was huge in terms of the

atmosphere around the club and the dressing room," he told the club website.

"We were desperate as a squad to win that game. It's the first time this group, a newish group formed at the start of last season and before this season, has reached the end of a competition together.

"We came through it really well and

hopefully we can take the positive experiences from that and try and build momentum for many more cup finals," added Cahill.

"We are very proud of winning our first trophy as a group together and getting that win at West Ham. But they are gone, all that is on our minds now is the PSG game."

Zlatan Ibrahimovic was missing through injury when PSG were beaten on away goals by Chelsea in last season's quarterfinals but the French club's talismanic striker is fit this time round.

Last month's first leg in Paris ended in a 1-1 draw and visiting coach Laurent Blanc wants his attack to be more ruthless than they were during Saturday's 4-1 victory over struggling RC Lens in Ligue 1.

"When you play a game like the one against Lens you must be efficient," said Blanc who criticised Argentine forward Ezequiel Lavezzi for wasting an opportunity in front of an open goal.

"If he misses the same chance at Stamford Bridge I won't be the only one who is not happy."

Perhaps the best part about this win was that it had broken long-established norms. They didn't depend on Shakib Al Hasan or Tamim Iqbal; they didn't look towards their army of spinners and neither did they buckle under pressure during crunch moments.

It was an underdog who scored the century; it was the pacers who made England's life miserable and it was the Bangladeshis who repeatedly came back in a match which saw the odds swing like a pendulum.

In general defeats can never be forgotten. We are, after all, just a click away from recalling the stat that Bangladesh had lost 13 out of their first 14 ODIs in 2014. However, they can be forgiven. And the way the Tigers roared in Adelaide on Monday, a major portion of the wounds of 2014 seemed to have healed, for it was a performance that met the hopes and expectations of 160 million.
