Asaduzzaman tells JS; police to get 50,000 more members

The government is planning to form a separate force to combat terrorism in the country, State Minister for Home Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal told parliament yesterday.

A Dhaka court yesterday rejected a prayer of Nagorik Oikya Convener Mahmudur Rahman Manna, seeking cancellation of a 10-day remand he is on now in a sedition case.

The metropolitan magistrate found no grounds for its scrapping because six days of the remand period have already passed. Manna was remanded on

Saturday, on expiry of a 10day remand in another case filed for "trying to instigate a revolt by the armed forces." The cancellation of the

fresh remand was sought on Wednesday, as Manna has fallen sick, his lawyer Abdul Mannan Khan said in the petition.

Manna was hospitalised following a complaint of chest pain on Tuesday night.

The Nagorik Oikya chief and BNP leader Sadeque Hossain Khoka were sued for sedition on March 5, nine days after the leak of a phone conversation between the two.


EKRAMUL KILLING CASE SC extends stay on Minar's bail till April 1

Bangladesh ideal hub of regional connectivity: USA About importance of emerging regional DIPLOMATIC CORRESPONDENT

The United States has said Bangladesh enjoys advantageous geography that makes it an "ideal hub" for connectivity and will continue to promote pan-Asian connectivity for cooperation with the countries in the region.

"Even closer to Kolkata, Bangladesh...is sometimes overlooked in the discussion about regional connectivity but it shouldn't be," a senior official of the US State Department told the "Building Pan-Asian Connectivity Conference" in Kolkata Tuesday.

Bangladesh is rich in natural resources and strategically situated at the intersection of China, South Asia, Southeast Asia, and the Indian Ocean, said Neil Kromash, deputy director, Office of South Asian Regional Affairs.

organisations, he said the US believed Bimstec was well situated to advance important regional objectives such as transit and trade.

On maritime sphere, he said, "We see the Indian Ocean Rim Association, or IORA, as a promising forum to address shared interests such as: freedom of navigation, anti-piracy, climate change, fisheries management, and maritime scientific collaboration. "So, promoting pan-Asian connectivity is an issue that has, and will continue to have a strong and enduring US commitment."

Kromash said the US was also watching the steps between India and Bangladesh to pursue the development of electricity grid connections, as well as other projects to the east such as the India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway.
