



The 1941 film told the tale of a young elephant who is mocked for his large ears which he learns to use to fly. Burton's version will use a mix of CGI and live


action, said the Hollywood Reporter.

## Dhaka Int'l Theatre Fest opens at BSA

The second edition of Dhaka International Theatre Fest began at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA) premises on March 12, amid much enthusiasm. International Theatre Institute (ITI), Bangladesh Centre in association with BSA is organising the fest.

Finance Minister AMA Muhith inaugurated the festival in presence of distinguished guests including Cultural Affairs Minister Asaduzzaman Noor, Cultural Affairs Secretary Ranjit Kumar Biswas, honorary president of ITI (worldwide) Ramendu Majumdar, BSA Director General Liaquat Ali Lucky, president of ITI Bangladesh Centre Nasiruddin Yousuff and general secretary Debaprosad Debnath.

Muhith said people should develop a taste for culture so that they can prevent the rise of the evil forces, while Asaduzzaman Noor insisted on the power of theatre and how it can present Bangladeshi culture on global platforms.

Theatre Designers' Institute (TDI) along with a group of theatre activists from different troupes participated in the grand opening ceremony called "Buk-e Biswas Paye Urbar Pali". It featured the age-old cultural heritage of this land and the glorious phase that the country went through. Chintak Theater of Gobindagonj, Gaibandha staged their production "Shashoto Bangla" at the inaugural ceremony at Nandan Mancha.

The 10-day long fest - from March 12 to 21 -- is being held simultaneously at three halls of BSA- National Theatre Hall, Experimental Theatre Hall and

Studio Theatre Hall.

About 23 troupes from four countries will stage their productions at the fest. A number of dialogues and workshops on different aspects of theatre are also on the festival calendar.

An exhibition hosting portraits of theatre icons across the world will be on display throughout the festival at the lobby of National Theatre Hall.

The festival is dedicated to theatre legend Shambhu Mitra to mark his birth centenary.

Today BotTala will stage "The Trial of Mallam Ilya" at Experimental Theatre Hall, Srishti Cultural Centre will stage "Badi Bandar Roopkatha" at National Theatre Hall and TheatrEX will stage "Dokkhina Sundori" at Studio Theatre Hall. The performance begins at 7pm every day.

### Tota Kahini mesmerises Chittagong audience

#### Sonar Tari's Homage to Prof Jamal Nazrul Islam

The play "Tota Kahini", staged by kids from Sonar Tari -- a cultural platform of Chittagong city's renowned alternative educational institute Fulki, drew full house at the auditorium of Theatre Institute, Chittagong (TIC) on Thursday.

Sonar Tari staged the playto pay homage to the country's eminent scientist Prof Emeritus Jamal Nazrul Islam -- who was also involved with the organsiation, on the eve of his second death anniversary. Penned by Nobel laureate poet Rabindranath Tagore, the play

allegorically uncovered how the existing education system of children: memorising, examinations and running towards success kills the inner innocence and creativity of children.

The whole auditorium remained at over-capacity with theatre enthusiasts, children and guardians in the two shows of the play, one held at 4:00pm while another at 6:00pm.

Mubidur Rahman Sujat planned and directed the play.

Uses of many popular Tagore songs like "Akash Bhora Surjo Tara" and "Aj Dhaner Khete" were worth mentioning. "If we do not create proper environment for children, perhaps they

would survive but their minds would dry up", said Fulki Principal Shila Momen after the staging of the play, adding that the Tagore's understanding is still relevant in the existing society.

Expecting regular shows from Sonar Tari, Md Masud, a member of the audience came with his family, said he was amazed to see the kids' performances.

Earlier, a brief discussion was held where Poet Abul Momen and Prof Jamal Nazrul Islam's widow Suraya Islam spoke, among others.

## Disney Announces "Frozen 2"

Disney has officially announced plans to produce a sequel to "Frozen." The company revealed plans during the Walt Disney Co.'s annual shareholders meeting on Thursday from San Francisco.

The first film's directors Jennifer Lee and Chris Buck are developing the project with producer Peter Del Vecho for Walt Disney Animation Studios, which took home the Oscar for animated feature for the film.

A release date and production details are yet to be announced.

The sequel doesn't come as much of a surprise, considering how the first film continues to be a major moneymaking force for Disney's divisions since its release Nov. 22, 2013 - and helped reinvigorate Walt Disney Animation Studios. "Frozen" generated nearly \$1.3 billion at the box office and has become a merchandising juggernaut, breaking sales records on home-video and at Disney's stores.

Outside of a Broadway show and the animated short "Frozen Fever", Disney has kept its "Frozen" sequel plans quiet until now.

"Frozen Fever", which reunites the toon's characters and song writers, will unspool in front of Disney's liveaction adaptation of "Cinderella" that came out in theatres this weekend.



"We enjoyed making 'Frozen Fever' so much and being back in that world with those characters," Lasseter said. "Jennifer Lee and Chris Buck have come up with a great idea for a sequel and you will be hearing a lot more about it and

we're taking you back to Arendelle. We are so excited about that."

Disney used its shareholder meeting to also announce details of its next "Star Wars" films, with Rian Johnson's "Star Wars: Episode VIII," to bow May

26, 2017, and Gareth Edwards' standalone Star Wars film, "Rogue One" to star Felicity Jones and be released Dec. 16, 2016.


