# 30 lakh expats may lose jobs

No encouraging progress from Malaysian contractor as Nov 24 deadline draws nearer

About 30 lakh Bangladeshi migrant workers could lose their jobs and face deportation as they would be carrying the old passports after the November 24 global deadline, when only machine readable passports would be acceptable.

Malaysian company IRIS Corporation Berhad, assigned to enrol the expatriates for MRPs, has failed to perform and is to be blamed for the looming disaster, said officials at the expatriates welfare ministry. The government was supposed to take the issue seriously and ensure that

all expatriates get the MRP before the deadline, set by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO). From November 25 onwards, foreign governments might not accept the

old passports. Expatriates carrying them might first lose their jobs and then get deported, fear officials at different foreign missions.

According to the expatriates welfare and overseas employment ministry, an estimated 60 lakh expatriate workers live abroad, most of them in the Middle-East.

Of them, 20 lakh expatriate workers have MRPs.

With the current pace of MRP issuance, some nine lakh more could have MRPs before November 24, which would leave some 30 lakh people with

### Sanga walks away happy

Kumar Sangakkara bid farewell to limited-overs cricket on Wednesday, disappointed with a World Cup quarterfinal defeat but happy that Sri Lanka were in a better place than when he came into the side in 2000.

The elegant left-hander scored 45 runs against South Africa to take his tournament tally to 541, including his record four successive centuries, but it never looked like being enough as Sri Lanka were blown away at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

"It's disappointing to lose but to win against a side like South Africa we have to do really well," he told reporters.

"If you take our innings, it was a lot of stop starts, but a lot of wickets falling together ... We weren't good enough today.

# Dhaka, Ctg city polls on Apr 28

EC asks aspirants to remove posters in 48 hours

Elections to Dhaka and Chittagong city corporations will be held on April 28, according to the polls schedule announced yesterday.

Mayoral and councillor aspirants can file applications from today till March 29 seeking candidature in the polls. More than 42 lakh voters are entitled to exercise fran-

chise in the long-overdue polls to Dhaka north and south city corporations and over 18 lakh voters in Chittagong. They are to elect three mayors and 179 councillors for the

three city corporations.

Announcing the schedule at a press conference, Chief Election Commissioner Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad sought wholehearted support from all political parties and city dwellers to hold the polls in a free and fair manner. "Electoral laws and the code of conduct are the major

things. We urge all aspiring candidates to follow these rules for the holding of free and fair elections," he said at the Election Commission Secretariat.


