BERGMAN VERDICT War crimes tribunal clears another of contempt STAFF CORRESPONDENT

International Crimes Tribunal-2 yesterday cleared of contempt of court charge another eminent person, the 25th among 49 who had in a statement expressed concern over the sentence of Dhaka-based British journalist David Bergman for demeaning it.

Led by Justice Obaidul Hassan with members Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah and Justice Md Shahinur Islam, the tribunal also fixed April 1 to pass further order on the remaining 24 signatories.

Now abroad, Dina M Siddiqi, through the foreign ministry, tendered her unconditional apology, as had expressed the previous 24 for the statement, said the tribunal sources.

On December 2, 2014, the tribunal found

It is pertinent even today to follow the ideals of noted satirist and politician Abul Mansur Ahmad for people's social and economic emancipation, eminent intellectuals told a discussion yesterday.

He is still relevant politically and socially, said Golam Kuddus, president of Sammilito Sangskritik Jote.

The political consciousness of Abul Mansur Ahmad was for a language-based nation state, and it evolved around literature, politics and economy of then East Pakistan, which is now Bangladesh, said poet Asad Chowdhury.

"His ideals and thoughts can still pave the way for people's emancipation," he said.

Kaler Dhoni, a literary magazine and publishing house, organised the discussion at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy, marking the 36th death anniversary of Abul Mansur Ahmad, a renowned litterateur, journalist and politician of the sub-continent.

schools in the Chittagong Hill Tracts.

She asked the officials for incorporating subjects on different rural professions in primary education curricula so that students can learn about their predecessors' professions in schools.

The meeting was informed that the She also asked the officials to take enrollment rate of children at primary level was around 97.70 percent in 2014 against 93. 90 percent in 2009 while the dropout rate decreased to 20.90 percent She gave the directives while in 2014 from 45.10 percent in 2009.

The prime minister mentioned that the success in education sector was achieved as the government had taken various steps for widening the scope of education for all, particularly the formulation of the national children policy and creating pro-education atmosphere for all, including girls.

In this connection, Hasina mentioned that the government has taken initiatives to set up separate toilets for female students in each school.

She said a total of 26,193 registered primary schools and services of around 1,03,845 school teachers were nationalised while around one lakh new teachers were recruited.

Hasina also asked the authorities concerned for the continuation of midday meal for students and taking initiatives with the help of local people and guardians to create a fund voluntarily in every school to serve midday meal according to the students' choice.

HRFB also urges open rejection of police proposal for change

Says it will exempt law enforcers from accountability

Expressing concern over police's recent proposal to amend the Torture and Custodial Death (Prevention) Act 2013, a network of 19 rights bodies yesterday demanded that the government openly announce the scrapping of the recommendations, which it said ran counter to the constitution and would exempt law enforcers from accountability.

Human Rights Forum Bangladesh (HRFB), in a press release, said the government should make it clear that impartial and credible investigations would be conducted into the allegations of torture against anyone. No-one will be let off the hook if they are found guilty, it read.

Torture and death in custody is a sheer violation of human rights, and it is worrisome when the law enforcers facing such allegations make the recommendations of changes, the release added. In the act passed in 2013, the
