Gordon-Levitt to star in 'Fraggle Rock' Movie

Joseph Gordon-Levitt will produce and star in the liveaction "Fraggle Rock" movie.

The bigscreen adaptation of the musical puppet series created by late Jim Henson has been in the works for nearly a decade, but the attachment of Gordon-Levitt constitutes a major boost.

"Fraggle Rock", debuted on TV in 1983, centers on the adventures of cavedwelling creatures called Fraggles who have to deal with the industrious Doozers and furry giants



"The first screen personas I ever loved were Henson creations, first on 'Sesame Street,' and then on 'Fraggle Rock,'" Gordon-Levitt said.

"Jim Henson's characters make you laugh and sing, but they're also layered, surprising, and wise. I've never stopped loving his work, even as a young frisky man, and on into adulthood," he added.



Dhaka will remember Draupadi

Curtains on Int'l Theatre Fest at Shilpakala

...... Theatre troupe Kalakshetra from Manipur, India staged their much-acclaimed production "Draupadi" at the National Theatre Hall of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy. The show was held as part of 2nd Dhaka International Theatre Fest on Friday evening.

The play has been directed by noted thespian Heisnam Kanhailal based on Mahasweta Devi's story about the marginalised people living in the far-flung hilly regions of India.

"Draupadi" depicts a striking tale of neglected humanity and how indigenous women in the Indian state of Manipur are subjected to sexual harassment at the hands of the military.

The one-hour piece was bold enough to strike the audience with its dramatic representation of gruesome reality. It's a tale of rebellion by the protagonist named Draupadi, a Santhal woman. Failing to bear the agonies of being gang-raped by army personnel, she finally opens her mouth and protests the injustice that had been done to them.


The play inspired by a true story that tremendously moved Kanhailal and his wife Sabitri, who play the elderly Draupadi in the play. However, the play was not welcomed in his state Manipur as a certain class of society thought women should keep their mouth

shut to keep chastity.

In the play, Draupadi represents sexually oppressed women in general who have for long undergone this torture and could not say anything. Her silent cries bring tears to the audiences' eyes. The Dhaka audience could easily relate to the play as scores of women in this country also went through similar situations during the Liberation War in 1971.

Not only did the actors show their outstanding acting prowess on stage but the music -- produced in the backstage combining folk instruments -- was brilliant too.

The 10-day long biennial theatre festival came to end yesterday.

"We will spread the fire of theatre"

...... Chinese opera troupe Youngfu Promotion and Protection Centre performed at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy as part of the 2nd Dhaka International Theatre Festival. In a recent interview, Lin Chau Jun, the team leader of the troupe and secretary general of Theatre Association of Guangxi Province, China shared his views on theatre in his country and more. Excerpts:

"It feels great to be here for the first time for a theatre performance. I love Bangladesh as I learned that the great poet Rabindranath Tagore who has written its national anthem called this country a golden land. I was looking forward to coming here."

Asked about their performance, he said "We gave you a very interesting traditional Chinese opera. This is very popular in different parts of China. We call it beautiful melodies. Also the troupe comes from a beautiful place called Youngfu which literally means 'forever happiness'."

About his country's cultural heritage and how culture helps develop human beings, Lin said, "China has a long history and a rich heritage indeed. So culture has been the reflection of the inner being of the Chinese people."

He further added, "I believe that a dance piece can make people happy and sad. It is very natural. So, we Chinese people express our emotions through arts like theatre."

He believes that this festival will boost friendship between the two countries. "This



year also marks 40 years of the diplomatic relationship between Bangladesh and China. We believe that this is only a start and it is part of the exchange that will happen later."

Asked what can be done to exchange culture on global platforms he said, "I think there should be a universal platform where theatre troupes from every country can display their productions. We must focus on the exchange of young theatre activists, particu-

larly university students." "In China we organise a national campus where youths participate; I have organised four such sessions. We will spread the fire of theatre from generation to generation," he added.

About the essentials of a good production, Jun said, "Firstm one needs a good story which people can appreciate. Take the stories of Shakespeare; they are accepted everywhere. Then there comes expressions which is crucial for theatre people. A performer should have techniques to create rapport with the audience to make the performance more interactive."
