VANDALISM CASES HC grants bail to Jubo Dal chief Alal

The High Court yesterday granted six months' adinterim bail to Jubo Dal President Syed Moazzem Hossain Alal in two vandal ism cases, clearing the way for his release from the Kashimpur jail-2.

Alal was arrested on December 24 last year in the cases filed for attacking the ruling party's Netrakona-1 lawmaker, Chhabi Biswas, and vandalising his car, and preventing police from discharging duties in Dhaka Medical College Hospital area the same day.

The incidents occurred when BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia appeared before a court in Bakshibazar in Dhaka in the Zia orphanage and Zia charitable trust corruption cases on December 24.

ABU SAYEED MURDER CASE Informer Geda confesses to crime

Points finger at two other cohorts

Ataur Rahman Geda, a source of law enforcers, yesterday confessed to his link to the kidnap and murder of Abu Sayeed before a magistrate's court. Before the court, Geda also gave

information about two others who had connections to the killing, said police who were trying to arrest them. Earlier two other arrestees, constable Ebadur Rahman of

Airport Police Station and Nurul Islam Talukdar alias Rakib, Ulema League general secretary of Sylhet district unit, had also confessed to the crime. After a three-day fresh remand, Geda was sent to jail, said

Md Rahmat Ullah, additional deputy commissioner (media) of Sylhet Metropolitan Police. Quoting court sources, police said Geda corroborated the statements of Ebadur and Rakib before the court. He told the court that they kidnapped Sayeed for ransom, but

later murdered him as Sayeed recognised them. Criminals kidnapped Sayeed, a fourth grader of Shahi Eidgah Hazrat Shahi Mir Govt Primary School, on the way SEE PAGE 4 COL 4

Govt must provide basic amenities to urban poor

Development practitioners tell workshop, saying the population deserving for their contribution to economic development

The government is duty-bound to provide basic amenities like safe water and housing to the urban poor living in slum settlements for their direct contribution to the country's economic development, leading development practitioners told a workshop yesterday.

The slum dwellers, as per a survey on seven settlements in Dhaka, Chittagong and Bogra, prioritised safe drinking water, adequate quality latrines, sanitation, housing, schools and job security as needs to escape the Development (BIGD). vicious cycle of poverty, ill-health and illiteracy.

For these priority needs, including basic hygiene knowledge and medical services, this enormous population living in informal settlements remain trapped in a vicious cycle of poverty and fail to live a decent human life, said the survey.

It was conducted by the Institute of Development Studies (IDS) of the University of Sussex, UK in collaboration with ActionAid Bangladesh and Brac Institute of Governance and

IDS and ActionAid Bangladesh organised the workshop, "Informal Work and Wellbeing in Urban Areas", at a Gulshan hotel in the capital.

Over 90 percent of respondents said to have used shared latrines, said Prof Ferdous Jahan of BIGD.

Farah Kabir, country director of ActionAid Bangladesh, who moderated the consultation, said there were examples of the Indian government providing some basic amenities to slum dwellers in Kolkata and Mumbai.




