

ISIS releases US military 'death list'

Calls on sympathisers to kill 100

The US Marine Corps yesterday urged "vigilance" after a group claiming to be Islamic State hackers published what they said were the names and addresses of 100 military personnel and urged supporters to kill them.

The warning came after a group calling itself the Islamic State Hacking Division posted information about members of the air force, army and navy, including photos and ranks, on the Internet, according to monitoring group SITE Intelligence.

The US Marine Corps said it was visiting all affected staff, and urged caution online.

"Vigilance and force protection considerations remain a priority for commanders and their personnel," US Marine Corps Lieutenant Colonel John Caldwell said in a statement.

"It is recommended Marines and family members check their online/social footprint, ensuring privacy settings are adjusted to limit the amount of available personal information."

Caldwell added the threat remained "unverified."

The self-proclaimed ISIS Hacking Division said it took
the information from government servers, databases and

FLOUTING ELECTORAL RULES

EC wants returning officers to act

The Election Commission wants the returning officers to take actions against violations of electoral code of conduct by potential mayor or councillor aspirants of Dhaka rather than taking the issue upon itself.

But the returning officer of Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) has taken no action against the aspirants who have jumped the gun on campaigning.

Shah Alam, the RO of the elections to

DNCC, said, "We have not found any electoral campaign materials like billboards, banners and posters on display."

However, a visit by The Daily Star found several hundred electoral posters of dozens of councillor aspirants on walls at places in Dhaka north, including Kazipara, Sheorapara and East-Rajabazar yesterday.

AZM Nasir seeks blessings from Mohiuddin

The ruling Awami League blessed mayor candidate AZM Nasir Uddin said he would contest the upcoming Chittagong City Corporation polls as per the plan and suggestion of party's city unit President ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury.

Nasir said this yesterday at Mohiuddin's residence after seeking blessings from the veteran AL leader, who was three times CCC mayor.

Earlier on March 14, Mohiuddin after returning from Saudi Arabia declared to join the mayoral race.

However, a meeting of the AL central committee held at Gono Bhaban in presence of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina declared AZM Nasir as the mayor candidate for CCC on March 20.

Mohiuddin later said he would work for Nasir, but frustration is reportedly prevailing among his supporters in the city, according to sources.

Tortured Prothom Alo journo denied bail

A Patuakhali court yesterday denied bail to ABM Mizanur Rahman, Baufal upazila correspondent of Bangla daily Prothom Alo.

Police around 8:00pm on Tuesday arrested Mizanur from Kalaiya Bazar area in Baufal in connection with assaulting a policeman and Abdul Halim Khan, assistant sub-inspector of Baufal Police Station, filed a case afterwards.

While in custody, he was reportedly tortured by policemen, allegedly led by Officer-in-Charge Noresh Chandra Karmaker of Baufal Police Station. At one stage Mizanur lost consciousness and the police took him to Baufal upazila hospital. But the policemen returned with him without treatment reportedly because some local journalists were at the hospital.
