
'VILLA COULD RETURN'

Costa blow for Spain

Spain forward Diego Costa will miss the holders' Euro 2016 qualifier at home to Ukraine on Friday and a friendly away to Netherlands four days later due to a hamstring injury sustained playing for Chelsea at the weekend.

Spanish soccer federation (RFEF) medical staff confirmed the injury in tests in Madrid and Costa has withdrawn from the squad, the RFEF said on Spain's official website on Tuesday.

"Diego Costa will return to Chelsea where he will undergo the corresponding medical treatment," the federation added.

Spain coach Vicente del Bosque has already drafted Juanmi in as cover, the 21year-old Malaga forward winning his first call-up after representing Spain at junior level.

With four matches played, Spain are second in Group C on nine points, three behind leaders Slovakia and level with Ukraine.

Goal-king plans coaching career





Germany's record World Cup goal-scorer Miroslav Klose plans to become a coach, as he contemplates retiring, and harbours dreams of working in the Bundesliga again. "The Bundesliga will be my goal, because I

can't imagine that I'll always be a youth team coach," Klose, who retired from international footballer after the World Cup, told German magazine Kicker.

"When I work towards my coaching licence I will really go for it, just like most things I do.

"Coaching at the German Football Association (DFB) is

one possibility.

"Hansi Flick (the DFB's sports director) and I will cer-

tainly sit down and talk. "I have seen many of Germany's national youth teams

play and it would be exciting to work with them." The 36-year-old set a new record of 16 World Cup goals when he scored in Germany's historic 7-1 win over the hosts

in the semi-finals of Brazil 2014 and is the first player to have appeared in four consecutive World Cup semifinals. Having played for Kaiserslautern, Werder Bremen and

Bayern Munich in Germany's top flight, Klose currently plays for Italian side Lazio but his current contract expires at the end of the season and he is considering retiring from all football.

"It will be a spontaneous decision, I will talk to my family first, as always, and there are a few other things to consider," he said.

"Lots of things are possible, maybe even a return to the Bundesliga, but there has been no specific contact."

Brazil probes graft claims

Brazil said Monday it has ordered an investigation following allegations that the subsidiary of a German company paid bribes to officials in connection with World Cup contracts last year.

The justice ministry told AFP that Justice Minister Jose Eduardo Cardozo would examine some \$6.5 million worth of contracts with German engineering firm Bilfinger involving alleged com-

pliance violations. Earlier, reports in Germany quoted Bilfinger as saying it was investigating possible violations of the Group's compliance regulations regarding orders for the supply of monitor walls and software for security control centres at several

Brazilian sites. The firm cited suspected bribery payments from employees of Bilfinger subsidiary Helmut Mauell to Brazilian pub-

lic officials and employees of state companies. The firm, indicating its compliance system met international standards, promised to take action if violations are officially confirmed.

"The England medical team took the decision on Monday evening having assessed Daniel following the squad's arrival at St. George's Park on Monday afternoon.' Sturridge's absence could mean a first cap

for in-form Tottenham striker Harry Kane, who took his goal tally for the season to 29 with a hattrick against Leicester on Saturday.

Italy coach Antonio Conte believes that players of Italian descent should be free to decide whether they want to play for the "azzurri".

Argentinian-born Franco Vazquez (Palermo) and Brazilian-born Eder (Sampdoria) became the latest 'oriundi' -- players born to Italian emigrant families -- to be called up to the national

squad. "I'm not the first (to call-up a player of Italian descent) and I won't be last," Conte told a news conference on

Monday. "In the past (Mauro) Camoranesi won the World Cup with Italy. (Christian) Ledesma, (Gabriel) Paletta, Thiago

Motta, Amauri and Romulo all played with the national team. "At the last World Cup, of the 736 players that took part

83 were born in a different country from the one they were playing for," Conte added.

Inter Milan coach Roberto Mancini expressed a different opinion earlier on Monday. "I believe that an Italian player deserves to play for Italy,"

Mancini said. "Anyone who wasn't born in Italy, even though he may

have Italian relatives, shouldn't be allowed to play. At least this is my opinion." Conte said Vazquez had made it clear right from the start

that he wanted to represent Italy. "It's not that I forced him to accept," the coach added.

Vazquez's mother was born in Padua and Eder's great

grand-father was from Treviso. Italy travel to Bulgaria for a Euro 2016 qualifier on


