

Netanyahu takes U-turn on Palestine

After Obama jibe, he extends 'hand of peace' to Palestinians

Benjamin Netanyahu said Wednesday Israel wants peace with the Palestinians as he was tasked to form a government a week after saying they

won't get a state if he is re-elected.

"Our hand is held out in peace to our Palestinian neighbours and the people of Israel know that real peace -and our future -- will only be assured if Israel is strong," he said after his surprise victory in a March 17 election.

As the Israeli premier works to build a new coalition government at home, he faces one of the worst confrontations in his stormy relationship with the White House.

He has tried to play down declarations he made during his recent victorious election campaign in which he

ruled out the creation of a Palestinian regional stability. state and stigmatized Arab voters.

But Obama has not let him off the hook and, after White House leaks accused Israel of spying on US-Iran nuclear talks, he insisted the allies have more tough talking ahead.

On Tuesday, US President Barack Obama said that his disagreement with Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu represents a substantial policy difference and not a personal vendetta.

"The issue is a very clear, substantive must be part of a negotiated peace deal. challenge," Obama told reporters at a joint White House news conference with Afghanistan's President Ashraf Ghani.

"That's our view and that continues to be our view. And Prime Minister Netanyahu has a different approach."

Since Netanyahu's party won Israel's March 17 election, not a day has passed without a US comment -official or otherwise -- on the implications of his hardline rhetoric.

War on ISIS US mulls airstrikes on Tikrit

Washington is considering launching air strikes, possibly within days, to back up Iraqi and Shiite forces battling to recapture Tikrit from the Islamic State jihadist group, US officials said.

The statement came Tuesday after an official said the US was already providing reconnaissance support for Iraqi forces there, the first confirmation of American involvement in the operation.

Such assistance could help Iraqi forces move forward with their largest operation against IS jihadists to date, which enjoyed initial success but has since stalled into a siege, with the city surrounded but not retaken.

A US-led coalition has targeted ISIS with air strikes and provided training and equipment to Iraqi forces, but had not previously announced direct assistance for the Tikrit operation, in which Iran has played a major role.

Possible air strikes near Tikrit are "being discussed at a high level" and could be days or weeks away, a US official told AFP.

The delicate diplomatic and military aspects of such an option are still being worked out, said the official who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Hadi 'flees' as Huthis

Yemen's leader was rushed to a "secure location" yesterday as rebel forces bore down on his southern stronghold and a warplane attacked his presidential complex, prompting pleas for urgent intervention.

Raising the risk that the Middle East's top oil power will be drawn into the worsening Yemeni conflict, US officials said Saudi Arabia was moving heavy military equipment including artillery to areas near its border with Yemen.

The escalating turmoil has stoked fears that Yemen -- a front line in the US battle against al-Qaeda -- is teetering on the brink of all-out civil war.

The slide toward war in Yemen has made the country a crucial front in Saudi Arabia's region-wide rivalry with Iran, which Riyadh accuses of sowing sectarian strife through its support for the Houthis.

The conflict risks spiraling into a proxy war with Shia Iran backing the Houthis, whose leaders adhere to the Zaydi sect of Shia Islam, and Saudi Arabia and the other regional Sunni Muslim monarchies backing Hadi.

One US government source described the size of the Saudi buildup on Yemen's border as "significant" and said the Saudis could be preparing air strikes to defend Hadi if the Houthis attack his refuge in the southern seaport of Aden.

On the ground, Houthi militia forces backed

by allied army units seized al-Anad **YEMEN CRISIS** air base yesterday and appeared

close to capturing the southern port of Aden from defenders loyal to President Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi, residents said.

The Houthis, supported by heavy armor, are now within 20 km (12 miles) of Aden, sources

Meanwhile, a top aide of President Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi said the Western-backed leader had been taken to a safe haven "within Aden", the southern port city where he fled last month.

Earlier a source in the presidential guard said that Hadi had flown overseas, but the aide denied he had left the country.

In a major blow to the embattled leader, the Huthis said they had captured his defence minister in their push southwards.

Several missiles were fired by an unidentified warplane at Hadi's complex in Aden but missed his residence and hit an aban-

doned building, a presidential security official said. As the security situation worsened, Aden's

international airport suspended operations.

Hadi appealed to the UN Security Council on Tuesday to "shoulder its responsibilities... to safeguard Yemen from sliding into more chaos and destruction."

Earlier on Monday, Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Saud al-Faisal had warned on Monday that Arab countries might take action "to protect interests from Huthi aggression".



BBC sacks 'Top Gear' Clarkson

The BBC announced yesterday that it was dropping one of its most popular presenters, "Top Gear" host Jeremy Clarkson, after he verbally and physically attacked a producer.

"It is with great regret that I have told Jeremy Clarkson today that the BBC will not be renewing his contract," **BBC Director-General Tony** Hall said in a statement.

Clarkson's contract with "Top Gear", which draws more than 350 million viewers around the world, is thought to expire at the end of this month.

His departure will have financial implications for the broadcaster, whose commercial arms BBC Worldwide earns around £50 million each year from the show.

Nigeria denies new mass kidnappings

Nigeria's government yesterday denied reports of a mass kidnapping in the country's northeast, as Boko Haram militants flee a four-nation military offensive.

"There is no fresh kidnapping in Damasak," Nigeria's national security spokesman Mike Omeri told AFP, referring to the town recently retaken by forces from neighbouring Chad and Niger.

Reports suggested that the Islamist militants, who seized the town in Borno state earlier this year, made off with hundreds of children as they fled the troops' advance. BBC reported that 'about 500' children were kidnapped citing local sources.

But Omeri said Nigeria had no information about a mass abduction.

The militants do have a track record of mass kidnappings, however, including the high-profile abduction of more than 200 schoolgirls in April last year from the Borno town of Chibok. Details about the kidnapping were muddied for weeks by military and official denials of details reported by the affected families.

The disputes over what actually happened were finally laid to rest when Boko Haram released a video picturing dozens of the hostages, who were subsequently identified

Several sources said it was possible, and perhaps even likely, that scores of Boko Haram conscripts were missing, feared kidnapped by the militants across the region.

But they denied a specific mass abduction in Damasak, where the Chadian military last week said that about 100 bodies, some of them decapitated, were found in a mass grave.

A senior intelligence source in Borno's capital Maiduguri said there was "no iota of truth" to the mass abduction claims.
