Nasir earns more than Manjur

Awami League-backed mayoral aspirant AJM Nasir Uddin has an annual income of over Tk 3.60 crore while his rival BNP-backed mayoral candidate M Manjur Alam Manju's annual income stands at Tk 1.92 crore that includes his yearly salary of Tk 8.49 lakh for his mayoral job.

The information was found in their respective affidavits submitted to the Election Commission office in Chittagong on March 29. The Daily Star has collected copies of both the affidavits. According to Nasir's affidavit, he is

involved in six types of business: berth operator, sweater factory, developer, fishing business, ghat lease and oil transportation.

Of his total annual income, Nasir earns Tk 3.20 crore from his businesses and Tk 42 lakh in allowance as director from a company's share, savings certificate and bank deposits. Besides, he earns Tk 3,000 honourium as Waqf beneficiary, Tk 4,744 from bank interest and Tk 25,000 from other sources.

The value of moveable property -including cash, bank deposit, proprietorship capital, stock exchange share, company share, life insurance, installment of DPS, electronics, FDR -owned by Nasir and his wife stands at Tk 11.99 crore, of which Nasir alone owns property of Tk 11.50 crore.

Nasir, who has a plot of 10 katha in the capital, is also owner of one sixth of his paternal residential and commer-

cial building. On the other hand, former CCC

Mayor Manju owns 12 industries and business firms. Despite Manju's involvement in

more businesses than Nasir's, the former showed his annual income as less than his rival's. In his affidavit, Manju has showed

himself as Managing Director, Chairman and Director of twelve business organsiations including Golden Iron Wax Ltd, Mostafa Hakim Housing and Real Estate Ltd, Alhaz Mostafa Hakim Cement Industries Ltd, Golden Oxygen Ltd, Eagle Star Textile Mills Ltd, Mutual Jute Spinners Ltd, Mostafa Hakim Bricks Ltd, Golden Bricks Works Ltd, Taher and Company Ltd, Golden Steel Works Ltd, HM Steel and Industries Ltd and Standard Bank Ltd.

The total value of his moveable and immoveable property is over Tk 36.01 crore. His wife's moveable and immoveable property are worth Tk 3.9 crore. The sectors of his income have been

shown as agriculture, business, share, bank deposit, lease rent, and rent from house, apartment and shops and other establishments.

Nasir has taken a loan of Tk 8.43 crore from Agrani Bank Laldeghi branch while Manju's individual bank loan stands at Tk 5.92 crore from two banks.

As Chairman, Director and MD of different business organisations, Manju owes Tk 359.29 crore in debt.

Salim claimed his resignation not accepted

Independent lawmaker Haji Mohammad Salim yesterday jokingly blamed Speaker Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury for his failure to take part in the Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) elections slated for April 28.

Before asking a supplementary question in parliament, Salim laughingly sang two lines of a song -- Haire Kopal Mondo, Chokh Thakite Ondho (Oh, what an irony! We have eyes but cannot see) and said, "Honourable Speaker, had you accepted my resignation, I would not have been here [in parliament]. I would have been in the south [DSCC to contest mayoral

In response, the Speaker asked, "Honourable parliament member, where is your resignation letter?"

"It was given to you," Salim replied. "Where is your resignation letter?" the Speaker again asked him. Salim said he submitted the resigna-

tion letter to her but it was torn.

Resignation as lawmaker is mandatory to take part in mayoral elections, according to the electoral laws.

Earlier on his Facebook page, Salim

wrote that he submitted his resignation letter to the parliament but the Speaker did not accept the letter. The Speaker earlier told The Daily

Star that Salim met her several times and discussed about his resignation but did not make any final decision to this end. He also did not submit any resignation letter, she added.

Salim was reportedly advised by the ruling Awami League high command to refrain from running in the upcom ing mayoral race for the DSCC.

rant. Suddenly a woman shouted out, 'Robbers are killing a man! Save him!'" a local told this correspondent. He rushed out of the restaurant and saw people in pursuit.

Police are now looking for the third attacker, identified as Taher by the two detainees.

Law enforcers recovered a meat cleaver from Ariful's haversack and two more from the spot, said DC Biplab.

According to his friends, Oyasiqur was known to Bangladesh-born US citizen Avijit Roy, a writer and blogger hacked to death on February 26 on Dhaka University campus. Avijit's wife Bonya too was

swooped on them.

"I believe the perception is that police are friends of people. Let alone acting as friends, police watched as Avijit writhed in pain and Bonya kept screaming for help after militants attacked the couple," said Ajay.

He demanded a reinvestigation into the matter with a team, comprising former judges and civil society representatives.

Avijit was hacked to death and his wife Rafida Ahmed Bonya was critically injured near TSC on DU campus around 8:45pm on February 26.

Ajay also demanded immediate resignation of Inspector General of Police (IGP) AKM Shahidul Hoque for failing to identify his son's kill- an "atheist".

"He (IGP) neither has the ability to combat militancy, nor he has the efficiency to find out the killers," Ajay told the Daily Star. On Sunday, Ajay met the IGP at the

latter's office and submitted a letter of complaint regarding inefficiency of police in maintaining law and order. The IGP did not answer the calls

made over his cell phone last night.

On March 16, Law Commission Chairman Justice ABM Khairul Haque said the IGP should have resigned immediately after the murder of Avijit.

A militant group called Ansar Bangla 7 claimed responsibility for the murder of Avijit whom it identified as

suspect of the murder.

Abbas has been facing an arrest warrant in a corruption case filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission. A Dhaka court on February 24 had

declared him a fugitive and issued the arrest warrant as he was absent in the court that day.

The electoral law disqualifies a fugitive from contesting the city polls.

A senior BNP lawyer said, "His [Abbas'] case is very critical. The only option for him now is to surrender before the court and seek bail. Even if he is not granted bail, he would then not be considered a fugitive. This would allow him to contest the election."

Police are scheduled to submit a report to the Metropolitan Sessions Judge Court of Dhaka on April 28 on the status of the arrest warrant. Under such a situation, the BNP will

wait for a few more days to announce its stance on the city polls. "We will announce our stance on

the city corporation elections after April 2," said Lt Gen (retd) Mahbubur Rahman.

If the BNP-blessed candidates cannot contest the mayoral polls, the party

would have no other option but to focus on the street agitation, mentioned Mahbub, a member of BNP

Chittagong is not so complicated for the party. The local BNP-led alliance has backed M Manjur Alam for mayor of CCC and started working for him.

PRESS STATEMENT The BNP-led alliance yesterday in a statement said people hope that the Election Commission and the government will take up proper initiatives to hold the city elections in a free, fair and

neutral manner. The 20-party combined alleged that the EC has been "favouring" the ruling Awami League-backed candidates in the elections.

"Tough speeches" of ministers, ruling party lawmakers and high officials of the law enforcement agencies on the election process are making the polls environment more "biased and panicky", said the release signed by BNP Joint Secretary General Barkat Ullah Bulu.

"The Awami League-backed aspirants are conducting electioneering in a very aggressive manner violating the electoral code of conduct, while the candidates supported by the opposition parties are not getting minimum scope to this end."
