Rizvi again on remand

A Dhaka court yesterday again sent BNP Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi Ahmed on a three-day remand in connection with an arson case.

The court passed the order after Sub-Inspector Makarias Das, also the investigation officer of the case, produced Rizvi before it with a five-day remand prayer.

The case was filed with Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Police Station against 14 leaders and activists of BNP-led 20party alliance, including Aman Ullah Aman, on charges of hurling crude bombs at a bus at Khejur Bagan near the Jatiya Sangsad in the capital on January 18 this year that left two students of Eden Mohila College seriously injured.

Three cops get legal notice OUR CORRESPONDENT, Patuakhali

The National Crime Observation and Legal Aid Society, a Khulna-based legal assistance provider, has sent a legal notice to three Patuakhali policemen over the torture of Prothom Alo's Baufal correspondent ABM Mizanur Rahman on March 17. The three were asked to reply within 10 days, explaining

under what legal authority they tortured the journalist and why they did this when such an act goes against the constitution, according to the notice. Otherwise, they will face legal step, it said. Rehana Chowdhury, investigation officer of the organisa-

tion, sent the notice by post on March 25, to Saheb Ali Pathan, assistant superintendent of police (sadar circle); Noresh Chandra Karmaker, officer-in-charge of Baufal Police Station; and Abdul Halim Khan, assistant subinspector of Kalaiya naval police outpost.

Police arrested Mizan on March 17 on the charge of assaulting ASI Halim and tortured him physically and mentally in custody on that night, alleged the journalist.

After he lost consciousness, the cops took him to Baufal Upazila Health Complex but brought him back without treatment because some local journalists were at the hospital at that time. The next day, Mizanur was sent to jail by a judicial magistrate.

Murders of bloggers worry UN, US International Humanist and Ethical Union

The United Nations has expressed deep concern over recent attacks on journalists and intellectuals in Bangladesh and called for the respect of basic rights in the country, including the rights of people to freedom of expression.

"...it's a matter of tremendous concern that different journalists and other intellectuals have been attacked," Farhan Haq, deputy spokesman for the UN secretarygeneral, said at a regular briefing at the UN

headquarters in New York yesterday.

Replying to a query whether he or any other UN official will visit Bangladesh for discussion, Farhan said, "I don't have any high-level travel to Bangladesh to announce at this stage... But you're aware of our concerns."

Blogger and online activist Oyasiqur Rahman Babu, 27, was hacked to death in broad daylight in Tejgaon Industrial area of Dhaka on Monday morning.
