COAL MINE GRAFT CASE

Khaleda's no-trust in an HC bench

Seeks another to hear her petition to withdraw charges

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday stated of not having confidence in a two-member High Court bench, set to deliver on April 5 a verdict on her petition seeking to scrap the Barapukuria coal mine corruption case against her.

Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) filed the case on February 26, 2008, accusing the former prime minister and 15 others of causing a loss of Tk 159 crore to the state exchequer by abusing power to award a Chinese company the contract to run the coal mine.

Khaleda apprehended being denied justice over two issues. One was that the verdict date was set without her lawyers' arguments being heard, one of Khaleda's counsels told The Daily Star quoting the no-confidence application as saying.

The other was that Justice Md Moinul Islam Chowdhury had been elected vice president of the Supreme Court Bar Association from the ruling Awami League panel before he became a judge, said the lawyer requesting anonymity.

Justice JBM Hassan is the HC bench's other member. Khaleda urged Chief Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha, who accepted the application at his Supreme Court office in the afternoon, to transfer the petition to another HC bench for hearing and disposal, said Bodruddoza Badal, one of Khaleda's four lawyers who submitted the application.

CASE AGAINST TARIQUE'S WIFE

HC allows ACC to place arguments

The High Court yesterday permitted the Anti-Corruption Commission to contest its seven-year old rule on a graft case against Zubaida Rahman, wife of BNP Senior Vice-Chiarman Tarique Rahman.

On September 26, 2007, the ACC filed the case against Tarique, Zubaida and her mother Iqbal Mand Banu for amassing assets through illegal means and concealing information in their wealth statements. According to the charge

sheet, Tarique accumulated wealth worth around Tk 2.75 crore beyond his known income sources and hid information about assets worth around Tk 2.17 crore in his statement. Zubaida and her mother were accused of aiding and abetting Tarique.

Yesterday, the HC allowed the ACC to become a party in the rule, SEE PAGE 5 COL 2
