ACC new website hacked

The newly launched website of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) was hacked on Thursday night. The hacker displayed messages urging the commission to refrain from corruption on the website inaugurated by the commission's Chairman M Badiuzzaman four days ago. ACC Commissioner Md Sahabuddin told The Daily Star that the commission's IT department was working to secure the site. As of last evening, the site (www.acc.org.bd) was inaccessible.

Vessel capsizes near Sandwip channel

A lighter vessel, carrying 1,000 tonnes of maize of City Group, capsized after being hit by another lighter vessel near Sandwip channel in Chittagong yesterday. Marmad-2 was heading for Narayanganj when another lighter vessel, Salman Selim, carrying cement clinkers, hit it at Bhasanchar around 8:30am. All 13 crewmen of Marmad-2 were rescued by the staff of Salman Selim, said Nobi Alam, general secretary of Lighter Vessel Workers' Union.

Rana Plaza collapse victims demand compensation

Family members of those who died in the Rana Plaza collapse and the surviving victims at a human chain beside Dhaka-Aricha highway in Savar yesterday reiterated their demand for compensation and declared April 24 a national mourning day for the RMG sector. The human chain was formed under the banner of "Garments Workers Front-GWF". The demonstrators also demanded punishment for those responsible for the collapse of the nine-storey building on April 24, 2013. The tragedy left 1,136 people dead and hundreds injured.

Repeated flaws in JU geography dept results may ruin students' dreams

Sloppy exam office going to publish honours results of 38th batch for third time

An entire batch of students of geography and environmental science at Jahangirnagar University is facing hurdles in applying for jobs and higher studies abroad because of a sloppy examination controller's office, which has twice published their honours results with flaws. It is preparing to publish the results for the third time now. The 38th batch, of 75 students, took the honours final exams in May-June 2013, and the results were published on February 10 last year, the students told a press conference at JU Journalist Association office on Thursday evening.

In a statement, they said, "Based on the results, we've applied for jobs at government and non-government organisations... some are preparing for viva voce... some have applied for higher studies in foreign universities." But one year later, the results were suddenly republished, on January 28 this year, they said. On condition of anonymity, an exam official told The Daily Star that the staff preparing the results made mistakes in writing the letter grade in consistent with the mark. The errors came to notice when the results were verified before the 5th convocation held on February 5, he said. A statement detailing the discrepancies in the two results shows that the grades of eight students fell in the second result sheet, while those of seven others remain unchanged. Five students failed. However, mistakes remained in the second sheet. Two students found mis-

matches in their CGPAs in the copies of the second result sheet - one sent to the department and the other kept at the exam controller's office. Shirin Akter, who saw her grade falling from A- (CGPA 3.64) to B+ (CGPA 3.46) in the second result sheet, applied for a review and discovered that her CGPA was actually 3.61.
