# DSCC Polls Khokon, Saifuddin 'violate' electoral code

Get show cause notices

The returning officer (RO) of Dhaka South City Corporation yesterday served show cause notices to Awami League-backed mayoral candidate Sayeed Khokon and Jatiya Party-blessed hopeful Haji Saifuddin Ahmed on the charge of violating the electoral code of conduct.

The duo have been asked to send explanations by 3:00pm today about why legal action will not be taken against them for the violation.

"In different media reports, we have seen that Sayeed Khokon sought blessings from people after Jumma prayers as a candidate," RO Mihir Sarwar Morshed told The Daily Star. "Besides, our magistrates have found that electoral posters of Saifuddin are still on display," he added.

Both acts are violation of the electoral code, he said, because candidates are not legally allowed to start campaign until 21 days from the polling day, or before April 7.

Meanwhile, AL-backed mayoral aspirant for Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) Annisul Huq in a press release yesterday said neither he nor any of his supporters was yet to launch his electoral campaign. "I will not be responsible if anybody driven by animosity conducts the electoral campaign including pasting posters," he claimed. On Friday, an executive magistrate fined a person for pasting posters in favour of Annisul Huq. Elections to the Dhaka and Chittagong city corporations will be held on April 28.

# Climate of intolerance breeding fanatics

Prof Emeritus Anisuzzaman tells Rukhe Darao Bangladesh discussion

Fanatics are killing people branding them followers of atheism, a belief at present considered a serious offence which contradicts the constitution of 1972, which encompassed socialism, democracy and secularism at a time when people had religious freedom, said Prof Emeritus Anisuzzaman yesterday.

"This can not be the picture of Bangladesh," he said, adding that in a democracy, hurting religious beliefs and barring freedom of speech was an offence.

The government does not allow opposition parties freedom of expression and to hold rallies while the latter bars people's free movement and their means of making a living, he said, urging the government to be strict in dealing with fundamentalism and militancy.

Prof Anisuzzaman was addressing a discussion of Rukhe Darao Bangladesh, a platform against fundamentalism and militancy, in Dhaka University's RC Majumder Arts Auditorium marking Independence Day.

Ain o Salish Kendra Executive Director Sultana Kamal, one of the platform's conveners, condemned the Awami league for keeping Islam as state religion and the Arabic phrase -- BISMILLAH-AR-RAHMAN-AR-RAHIM -- above the constitution's preamble.

Militants will not spare anyone, even those who patronise them, she said. Communalism has grown ten-fold com-

pared to the time of East Pakistan, said another convener, cultural personality Ramendu Majumder, adding that the present education policy did not contain teachings on respecting differing beliefs while children addressed classmates as Hindus or Muslims.

Poet Syed Shamsul Huq as the keynote speaker urged BNP to sever ties with Jamaate-Islami and join hands with the Awami League and all secular parties to resist Jamaat, militancy and fundamentalism.

He also termed investigations in the recent murders of Avijit Roy and Oyasiqur Rahman "unsatisfactory".
