Archrivals Awami League and BNP both breathed sighs of relief as Khaleda Zia finally returned to her residence yesterday, after staying at her Gulshan office for three Two hours before entering her Gulshan

house around 12:40pm, Khaleda surrendered before a Dhaka court and obtained bails in two corruption cases in which the court had ordered her arrest 39 days ago. Upon her appearance, the court with-

drew the arrest warrants in Zia Orphanage Trust and Zia Charitable Trust graft cases. The warrants had been issued after the BNP chief dodged court proceedings for four consecutive dates.

The latest developments are seen as a breakthrough in the prevailing political stalemate.

Khaleda Zia's Gulshan office was buzzing with activity on Saturday evening.

Party leaders and staffs, who had been staying at the office for the last three months, started packing their bags around 11:00pm.

They felt relieved that the BNP chairperson would return to her Gulshan residence after appearing before a Dhaka

"It was a great relief from the tensions we had been through for the last three months," Sayrul Kabir Khan, staff of BNP chief's Press Wing, told The Daily Star.

Political unrest hurts investment, growth

Causes a loss of around Tk 4,900cr in two-and-a-half months, says CPD analysis

Political unrest and illiberal democratic environment in the country have dented private sector investment in recent months, said Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) yesterday.

The think-tank said sluggish reform activities, especially the institutional ones, have also hurt the confidence of the investors.

"A kind of discomforting environment is prevailing in the country," Dr Debapriya Bhattacharya, distinguished fellow of CPD, told a news briefing at BRAC Centre Inn in the capital.
