## Man killed in his house

A man was killed in his building's roof in the capital's Gendaria in broad daylight yesterday.

Sunny Sarkar, 45, lived on Alamganj Road.

His elder sister Yeasmin Begum said, "Suddenly I saw Sunny appeared there from upstairs clutching his throat and stomach and blood was oozing out of his wounds. I asked him who did this but he could not speak as his throat was partly cut. But when I asked if it was my domestic help, Jummon, Sunny nodded." He was declared dead at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Yeasmin, who owns the building, went to the house with her son Md Mishal and Jummon alias Sagar on Thursday to repair the building.

Police said Jummon is absconding while Mishal was detained for interrogation.

# Trial of two Netrakona 'Razakars' begins

April 15 fixed for contempt charges against Azharul's lawyer, 5 Jamaat-Shibir leaders

The war crimes case against two alleged Netrakona "Razakars" began yesterday with the prosecution reading out some parts of the 24-page opening statement, saying they would be able to prove the six charges using documentary evidence and witnesses' testimonies.

Though the prosecution brought their first witness to testify, the three-member International Crimes Tribunal-1 fixed April 12 for recording the testimony as the defence sought more time for preparations.

Obaidul Haque alias Taher and Ataur Rahman Noni were allegedly involved in genocide and crimes against humanity in Netrakona during the 1971 Liberation War.

Meanwhile, the tribunal adjourned until April 15 hearing of a contempt petition against Tajul Islam, a counsel of war criminal ATM Azharul Islam, and five leaders of Jamaat-e-Islami and pro-Jamaat student organisation Islami Chattra Shibir for their statements before the media following a verdict.

# Road crashes kill 5, injure 22

Five people were killed and 22 others injured in road accidents in five districts yesterday and Saturday. In Dinajpur, A BGB man died when a bus hit his motor

cycle on Dinajpur-Rangpur highway in front of Ansar VDI office yesterday. The deceased was Shafiqul Islam, 25, of Paharpur area.

In Chittagong, Rani Akther, 25, a RMG worker, died

when a bus ran her over at sector four inside Chittagong EP2 area yesterday. Around 16 RMG workers were also injured as the bus

carrying them plunged into a roadside canal. In Natore Sadar, Shawkat Ali, 30, of Bonbelgharia vil-

lage died and six people were injured when a truck rammed into an auto-rickshaw in Tebaria area yesterday.

In Chapainawabganj, Waheduzzaman, 12, son of Zinnur Rahman of Umarpur village died when a truck hit his bicycle in Kansat area of Shibganj upazila yesterday.

In Panchagarh, Mir Ali, 45, of Nazirjoth village died when a truck hit his motorcyclist on Tentulia-Banglabandha road in Tentulia upazila on Saturday.

## 61,000 Yaba pills seized, 3 arrested CITY DESK

Around 61,000 Yaba tablets were recovered and three people were arrested in this connection in Chittagong and Narayanganj yesterday.

In Narayanganj sadar, Rab-11 officials posing as prospective buyers raided Bappi Traders and arrested two people with 50,000 Yaba tablets and Tk 8,000 at Nayaati in Shiddirganj area, said Rab.

The arrestees are Shafiqual Islam, 35, owner of Bappi Traders and Delware Hossain, 25.

Delware used to smuggle Yaba from Teknaf and sell them through Shafiqual, Rab added.

In Chittagong, a team of Department of Narcotics Control (DNC), Chittagong, recovered 11,000 Yaba tablets from a pick-up van in Moijjartek area of Patiya upazila.

They also arrested the driver Saddam Hossain, 27, of Cox's Bazar.

Tipped-off, DNC officials searched the van coming from Cox's Bazar around 1:30am and recovered the Yaba tablets worth Tk 63 lakh, said the officials.
