Sons in election fray against fathers' foes

Two sons have entered the battle of ballots against their fathers' opponents to become mayor of two Dhaka city corporations.

Sayeed Khokon, son of late Mohammad Hanif, will take the fight to Mirza Abbas in Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC).

Hanif was elected first mayor of Dhaka in 1994 when he beat Abbas by a huge margin. Like his father, Khokon, 45, has been blessed by the

Awami League. A member of the BNP national standing committee,

Abbas, 64, is enjoying his party's support again. In the mayoral race of Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC), Tabith Awal, son of senior BNP leader Abdul Awal

Mintoo, is likely to be the main challenger to Annisul Huq, an AL favourite. Tabith's father Mintoo, an adviser to BNP chief Khaleda Zia, had filed nomination paper to contest the April 28

Commission due to a procedural error. Thirty-six-year-old Tabith seems to be more fortunate than Khokon in terms of enjoying support from party high ups in electioneering.

polls. But his candidature was refused by the Election

There will be no legal bar on electoral campaigns by Khaleda Zia and her party bigwigs. However, Sheikh Hasina and many top AL leaders cannot hit the campaign trail.

Two decades ago, Hasina and her party colleagues had carried out an extensive campaign for Hanif.

Richie Benaud no more

Former Australia captain Richie Benaud, the celebrated 'voice of cricket', has died at the age of 84 after battling skin cancer, prompting a flood of tributes from around the world.

A giant figure in the game both on and off the field, Benaud died in his sleep in a Sydney hospice late on Thursday, his employer Channel Nine reported, citing family.

Benaud said last November he was fighting a skin cancer on his head and his public appearances became rare in recent years.

Health status in slums worse than in villages

Says Bangladesh Health Watch report

Poor healthcare system along with water, sanitation and environmental pollution remains a major challenge in the rapidly growing cities of Bangladesh, says Bangladesh Health Watch Report (BHW) 2014.

The issue is of paramount importance given the fact that Bangladesh is going to be an urban country by 2039.

However, there is a huge rich-poor

gap in the urban areas with the slum population facing serious consequences in terms of food, nutrition, water, sanitation and healthcare.

"Absence of basic amenities, all converge, is making the urban health status in the slums worse than that in the rural areas," says the report.

Citing an example, the report says only 36.3 percent slum dwellers are food secured against 52.4 percent such people in rural areas.

The report styled "Urban Health Scenario: Looking Beyond 2015" further says approximately 30 to 45 percent of slum dwellers are ill and 60 percent of their children are chronically malnourished at any given time.

Prof Dr Malabika Sarker of James P Grant School of Public Health of BRAC University presented the report at a side event of an international health conference at a city hotel in Dhaka. SEE PAGE 11 COL 5



Bringing Back Fugitive Killers of Bangabandhu US law firm hired

The government has again appointed a USbased law firm to take necessary steps for bringing fugitive killers of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman back home from North American countries, including the USA and Canada.

Law Minister Anisul Huq told The Daily Star yesterday that the government has so far traced only two convicts -- Nur Chowdhury in Canada and Rashed Chowdhury in the USA.

"If other convicts stay in the North

American countries, the law firm will fight for bringing them back to Bangladesh," he said without elaborating.

Two law ministry high officials, requesting anonymity, told The Daily Star that the ministry had recently given its positive opinion to a foreign ministry's proposal about appointing a law firm for fighting the legal battle to bring the killers of Bangabandhu back home.

They said the law ministry had permitted the foreign ministry to appoint Skadden, SEE PAGE 11 COL 1

Pakistan stays out of Yemen conflict

Lawmakers rebuff Saudi Arabia's call to join coalition against Shia militias

Pakistan's parliament yesterday voted to stay out of the conflict in Yemen, rejecting Saudi demands for Islamabad to join its military coalition against Shia Huthi rebels. A unanimous resolution passed by a special session of

parliament backed the government's commitment to protect Saudi Arabia's territory, which has so far not been threatened by the conflict.
