China has offered Bangladesh soft loans of \$15-20 billion to help it expand railway networks across the country.

Officials of the Chinese embassy in Dhaka placed the loan proposal at a highlevel meeting with Bangladesh officials at the Prime Minister's Office in January, railways ministry sources told The Daily Star.

Later that month, the PMO formed a three-member committee, headed by an additional secretary of the railways ministry, which primarily identified eight projects (Joydevpur-Ishwardi) involving \$897 involving \$10.79 billion.

Railways ministry officials said they sent a list of the projects to the Economic Relations Division of the finance ministry last month for holding discussions with the Chinese government.

Wishing anonymity, a finance ministry high-up said the ministry already sent a list of four projects to the Chinese government for assistance.

Rules broken in land acquisition

Says TIB report on Rampal, Matarbari projects

The government has violated some rules in acquiring land for two coal-fired power plants -- in Rampal and in Matarbari -- and those evicted from their land are still struggling to get compensation, the TIB said yesterday.

In a study, the anti-graft body found that the victims had to bribe officials three to 10 percent of their recompense in advance to receive the money.

"The TIB looked into the process of environment impact assessment and land acquisition of the two projects. It was found in the survey that the victim people had to bribe

between three and 10 percent of their compensation to officials," said Iftekharuzzaman, executive director of Transparency International Bangladesh, at a press conference.

Once in operation, each of the two projects would produce 1320MW electricity. The Rampal plant is expected to start operation in June 2019 and the Matarbari plant in June 2021. Mohammed Hossain, deputy

programme manager of TIB, presented the findings of the study, done between November 2014 and February 2015.
