

SCARLETT JOHANSSON to host 'Saturday Night Live'



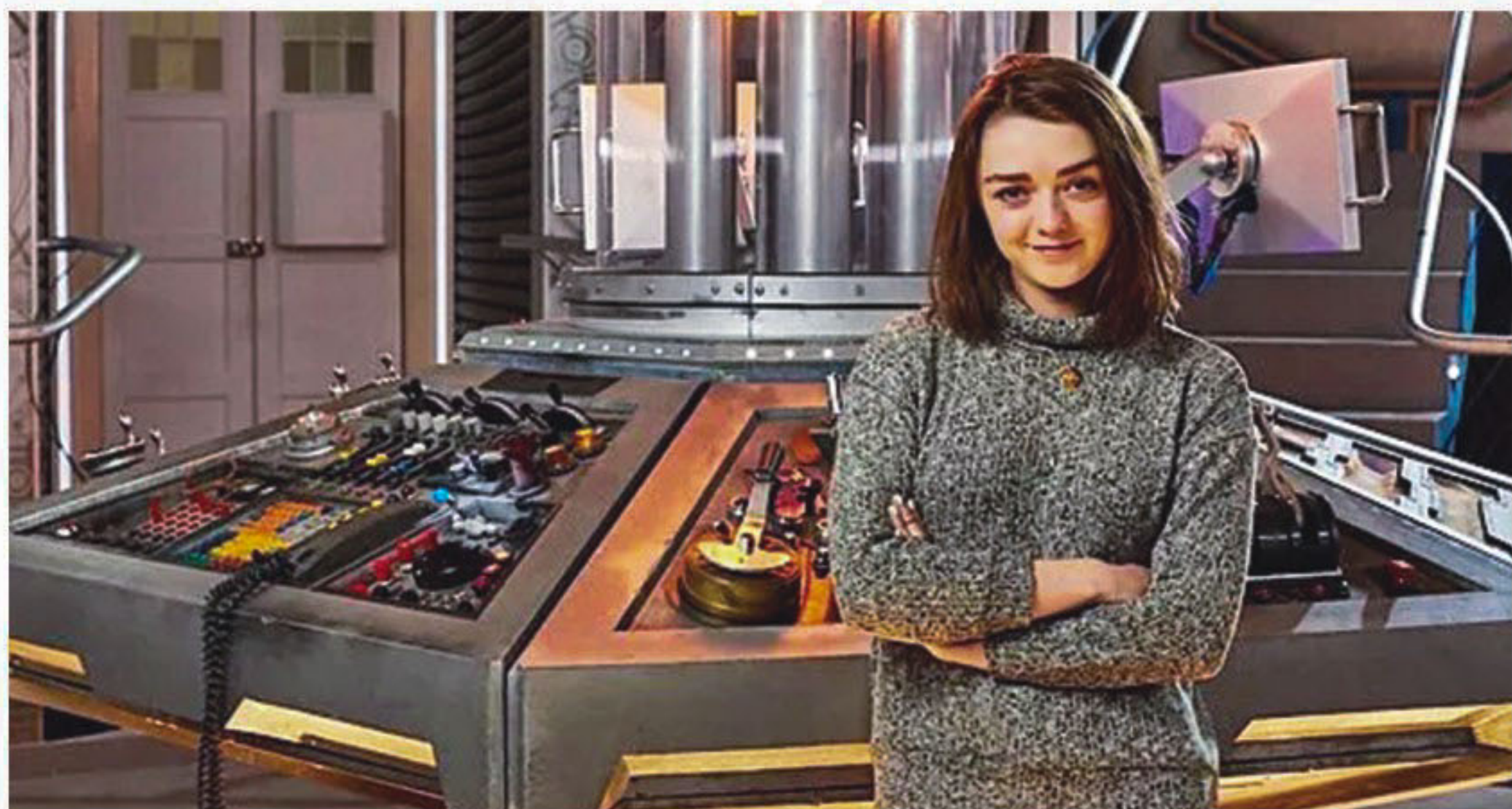
