But they aren't anymore safe in our rivers, home to world's 60pc hilsa. This four-part series focuses on the existential crisis, changing habitat and ways to conserve this much coveted fish.

# GILL NETS BURNT; FACTORIES BOOM

Fishes being wiped out of rivers as manufacturing units of death-nets not shut down

"Jhake Jhake jatka, current jaale atka."

This was part of the dialogue of a popular television advertisement aired in the early 90s to raise public awareness against jatka catching with gill net, locally called current jaal.

Despite such awareness campaigns, the use of gill net has never stopped as the government has done little to stop its production and trade. Cheap and effective in catching fish, this small-mesh net made of

monofilament synthetic nylon fibre is very popular among fishermen. The net easily traps hilsa fries or jatka -- less than 25cm in length. It is also a danger to other fishes, big or small, and aquatic species like SEE PAGE 2 COL 3

## Troubles different

BNP rebel-free but not in scene; AL full of rebels, faces campaign chaos

With just a week to go in election campaigns of the polls to city corporations, the Awami League and the BNP are still struggling to get all their ducks in a row.

The AL high command, despite hectic efforts, could not convince all AL leaders to quit running against party-endorsed councillor candidates.

In most wards of the three city corporations -- two in Dhaka and one in Chittagong -- AL-backed councillor BNP leaders refrain from campaigning

aspirants would face challenges from AL's own.

The party keeps issuing note of caution against those leaders who refused to back down, but they don't seem to budge.

However, the BNP camp does

not have this issue but has another. The party's senior- and midlevel leaders are yet to join the campaign for the party-backed mayor aspirants in the two city corporations in Dhaka.

The party leaders alleged that those

The entire situation has annoyed BNP chief Khaleda Zia. She on Friday night rebuked some of her party seniors when they went to meet her, sources added.

"Police and ruling-party men are harassing and obstructing our party men from campaigning," claimed BNP senior leader Moudud Ahmed while talking to The Daily Star yesterday.

### Police see it, finally

Police, albeit five days late, admitted that women were sexually assaulted during Pahela Baishakh celebrations in Dhaka University.


"We have noticed [in the CCTV footage] incidents that

fall within the definition of sexual assault," said Monirul Islam, joint commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police. He neither could say anything about the perpetrators, their identities nor did he have any arrests to show for.


He, however, asserted that no woman was stripped naked and that no woman had filed any complaints.

The DMP held a press briefing yesterday afternoon in the wake of scathing criticism of law enforcers for doing almost nothing during and after the attacks on women.
