Hasina calls for peace, security

Stresses South-South cooperation in fighting terrorism, climate change, human trafficking

UNB, Jakarta

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday called for a triangular South-South cooperation to fight terrorism, human trafficking and climate change.

"I believe the South-South and triangular cooperation has immense potential to foster development, achieve peace and security, fight terrorism and violent extremism," she said.

The PM made the remarks while addressing a plenary session of the second Asian-African Summit at the Balai Sidang Jakarta Convention Centre in Indonesia.

"Durable peace and security are pre-conditions to sustainable development," she told the summit.

"Indeed, the volatile regional and global security situation, terrorism and violent extremism continue to challenge development gains and our efforts towards peace and prosperity," she added.

Hasina, also chief of the ruling Awami League, said a set of transformative goals and targets were being identified in the context of the post-2015 development agenda.

FOUR-TIER DATA CENTRE

Good goal, ways to get it done questionable

The project had no financing and neither did it have any Development Project Proposal (DPP) approved by the planning ministry. Yet, the cabinet's purchase committee in late February approved a project to install a "tierfour" national data centre at a cost of \$154 million.

The job was given to Chinese ZTE Corporation. According to a highly placed source at the information and communication technology (ICT) ministry, only a few years ago Bangladesh Computer Council had installed a "tier-three" national data centre. Just 20 percent of it is being utilised.

"Even if we incorporate all data of all government institutions, 60 percent of the data centre will remain unutilised," the ICT ministry source said, adding: "Bangladesh does not need a tier-four data centre."

Trial of 2 more war crimes accused ends

The International Crimes Tribunal-2 yesterday concluded all proceedings in the war crimes case against Mahidur Rahman and Afsar Hossain Chutu of Chapainawabganj and kept the case waiting for verdict any day.

Mahidur and Chutu, alleged members of Razakar force in Shibganj upazila, face three charges including mass killing committed in the western district during the Liberation War in 1971.

Among the charges, two are related to killing of 28 people in separate incidents, while the other was related to looting and arson in two villages. The duo, SEE PAGE 10 COL 2

At least 11 people were killed and scores injured as a nor'wester swept through several districts, mostly in the northern parts of Bangladesh in the late hours of Tuesday and early yesterday.

The storm also destroyed a large number houses, uprooted trees and damaged crops. Rail communications between Dhaka

and Sylhet were snapped for seven hours till 9:00am yesterday as trees, uprooted by the storm, fell on the tracks at Lawachhara Reserve Forest in Moulvibazar.

and Jamalpur. In Habiganj, a woman and her son died when a tree collapsed on their house during the storm at Badauri village in Baniachang upazila. The deceased were identified as Nurjahan Begum, 22, and Rabin Mia, 4.

Ramzan Ali, 40, of the district's Nabiganj upazila was injured when a tree fell on his house. He was rushed to Upazila Health Complex where doctors declared him dead, said Liakat Ali, officer-in-charge of Nabiganj Police Station.
