Govt cancels 30-year deal

HC asks govt not to evict leaseholders in 3 months

The government has decided in principle to hand over the operational charge of Jamuna Resort to army by cancelling a 30-year lease to a consortium of Bangladeshi and foreign companies halfway through.

Bangladesh Bridge Authority (BBA) on Wednesday conducted a drive and vacated the resort by evicting around 180 staff of Jamuna Resort Ltd (JRL), the management consortium, without any prior notice. Pro-BNP businessman Abdul Awal Mintoo, whose son

Tabith Awal is vying for the Dhaka North City Corporation mayor's office with BNP's endorsement, is the chairman of the JRL.

According to JRL officials, all that the BBA authorities showed during the drive was a lawyer's certificate.

Later yesterday, a High Court bench directed the authorities concerned not to evict the JRL in three months.

Riddle over number of CCTV cameras

Varying accounts on the number of CCTV cameras installed for keeping the Pahela Baishakh celebrations under watch have caused confusion over the actual police surveillance.

Initially, the Dhaka Metropolitan Police provided journalists with a list detailing the number of cameras and their placement on Dhaka University campus. The DMP said there were 19 CCTV cameras installed around TSC. The Daily Star found 18 of the cameras in the list.

But actually there were 22 cameras

installed in that area, said sources in the Information and Communication Technology department at the DMP headquarters on April 21.

The ICT department was responsible for arranging and sorting out power supplies to the cameras.

The revelation adds substance to the allegation that police were trying to cover up the incident of sexual assault on women.

According to witnesses, including Liton Nandi, president of Bangladesh Chhatra Union's Dhaka University chapter, at least one woman was stripped almost naked on

Bangla Motor AL, BNP sue each other STAFF CORRESPONDENT Two more cases of attempted murder have been filed by the Awami League and BNP camps against one another follow-

ing an attack on Khaleda Zia's motorcade in the capital's Bangla Motor on Wednesday. Around 40 to 50 ruling party men were accused in the case filed by Abdul Qaiyum, an adviser to the BNP chairper-

son, yesterday. Babu Hasan, sports secretary of Bangladesh Chhatra League's Shahbagh unit, sued 20 to 25 BNP men in connection with the attack.

Earlier, both camps have filed two cases of attempted murder against one another following another attack on Khaleda's motorcade in the capital's Karwan Bazar on Monday.

Those who hurled bricks at Khaleda's motorcade and vandalised several vehicles when the BNP chief was campaigning for her party's mayor candidate on Monday evening are mostly leaders and activists of the ruling AL's associated bodies.

The Daily Star has identified a dozen of the attackers from video footage of the incident. The police are yet to SEE PAGE 17 COL 4

EU leaders mull military action

EU leaders were to meet yesterday to discuss possible military action against human traffickers in Libya in a desperate effort to halt the tidal wave of refugees trying to reach Europe by sea.

As Malta honoured the estimated 800 people who died in the Mediterranean's

worst migrant disaster with a poignant inter-faith funeral service for 24 of them, a draft statement for the summit seen by AFP committed leaders to "undertake systematic efforts to identify, capture and destroy vessels before they are used by traffickers".
