

McCartney tops 2015 musicians' rich list

WHAT'S ON

Former Beatle Sir Paul McCartney has topped the Sunday Times' Rich List of musicians with his £730m fortune. He is worth an estimated £20m more than last year, and enjoys a significant boost from his American heiress wife's £150m stake in her family's US trucking business.

It puts him well ahead of his nearest rival on the list, Andrew Lloyd Webber, who is estimated to be worth £650m.

Of the 1,000 richest people in the UK and the 250 wealthiest in Ireland,



the list puts Irish band U2 at third place. Pop veteran Sir Elton John and Rolling Stones' frontman Sir Mick Jagger follow with their fortunes.

For the third year running, singer-songwriter Adele, who is 26, has topped the list for young music millionaires under the age of 30 in Britain and Ireland, with an estimated fortune of £50m. The four members of the boy band One Direction plus former band mate Zayn Malik share the second spot.

every house, Tagore established the practice of refined and artistic form of dance in this part of the world," said Mustafa Monwar. Following the opening cere-


mony, artistes from a number of dance troupes including Sweet Bangladesh, Nataraj, Nrityanandan, Bulbul Academy of



Vin Diesel confirms "FAST AND FURIOUS 8"



With "Furious 7" roaring past the billiondollar mark at the box office, "Fast and Furious 8" seemed inevitable. But even fans of the franchise didn't probably expect it to be this soon.

Talking at CinemaCon in Las Vegas, franchise star Vin Diesel revealed that they are aiming to get the next movie into theaters on April 14, 2017. There aren't really any other significant details to share at this point, but with a date less than two years away, that seems to indicate that Universal Pictures has a plan in place, and from what Diesel said in the build up to "Furious 7", that could very well be the

Doing the press rounds for the film which became the fastest movie to reach \$1 billion dollar milestone at the box office, Diesel revealed a couple of juicy details about the current plans for "Fast and Furious 8". One is Kurt Russell's character, the shadowy government agent known only as Mr. Nobody, could play a bigger role in the next adventure. In fact,

Diesel said that Russell was hired for Furious 7 with the intention of beefing up

his presence in future arcs. It also sounds like "Fast and Furious 8" is taking the show on the road. No stranger to exotic locales, the franchise has been all over the world, but their roots have always remained in Southern California. Again, according to Diesel, New York, a city they haven't visited on screen yet, will figure prominently in the story.

In addition to beefing up Mr. Nobody's role, it also sounds like they're looking to invite a familiar face back to the party in the form of Eva Mendes. Reports circulated a while back that she could reprise her role as US Customs Agent Monica Fuentes from "2 Fast 2 Furious". She shows up in the post-credits scene from Fast Five, and if the story includes more government involvement, it's entirely plausible that she could show up.

Goethe-Institut Bangladesh, in partnership with Drik, is holding a photography exhibition, "From Kabul to Kolkata: of Belonging, Memories and Identity", at Drik Gallery in the capital.

The exhibition, showcasing the images of Moska Najib and Navez Afroz, opened yesterday at Drik Gallery.

Inspired by Rabindranath Tagore's "Kabuliwala", photographers Moska Najib and Nazes Afroz embarked on a threeyear-long journey to portray the story of a century of social transformations within the community.

The two photographers have captured

the stories of this secluded and littleknown settlement of Afghani merchants in India in photographs. Moska Najib, an Afghan by origin but

living in India for most of her life, says, "Being away from my homeland, I've always been drawn to the themes of identity and new belongings. This inspired me to photograph one of the oldest settled Afghan communities in India in modern times."

Najib hopes that the photographs on display will allow viewers to experience the tension between preserving an identity and rebuilding a home in a new space.

The exhibit will run from 3pm to 8pm every day till May 6.
