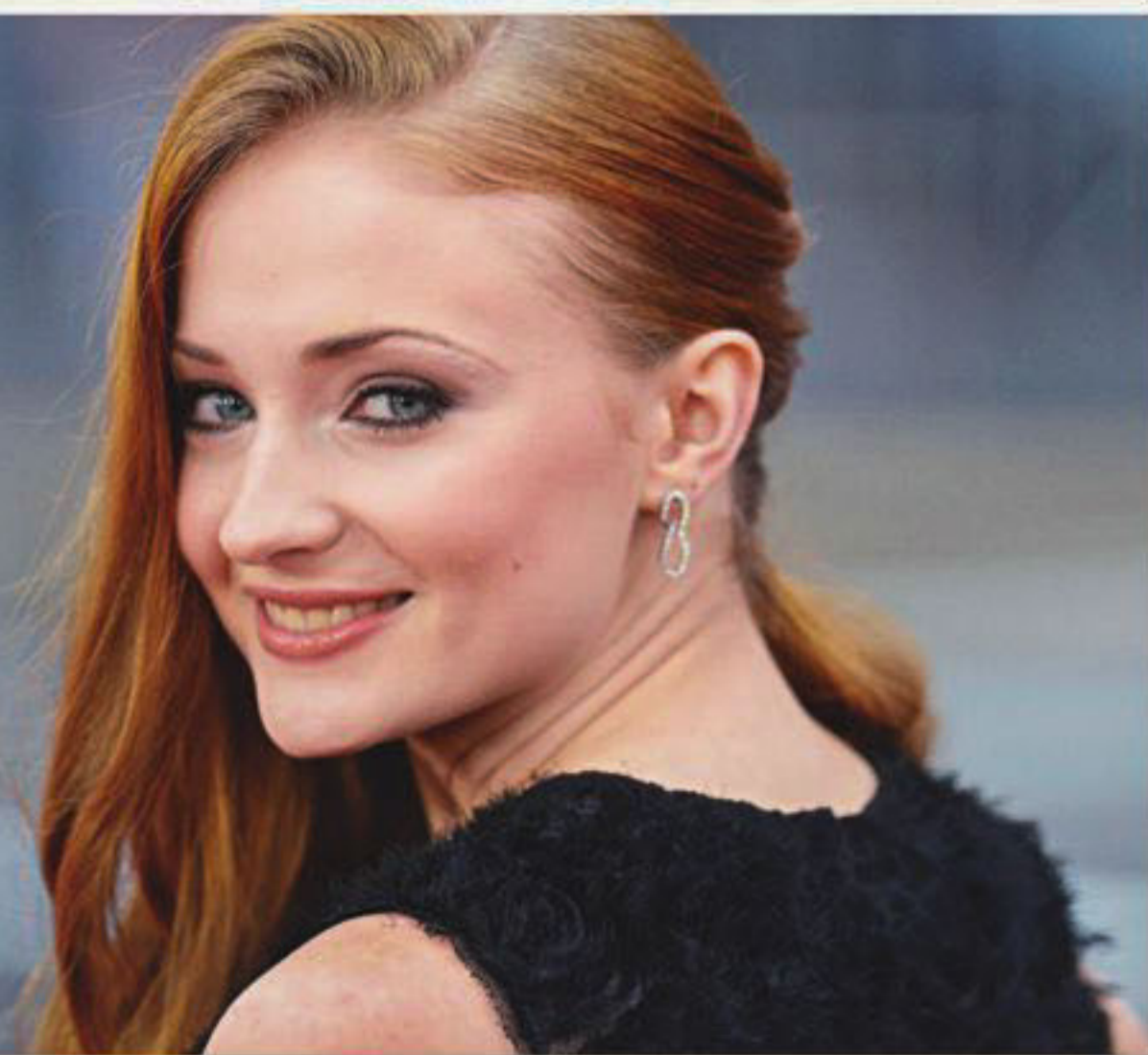
BEING BISEXUAL IS NATURAL
