Batman Challenges Superman in new trailer

"Do you bleed?" asks a grim dark knight in his mechsuit. "You will." He answers, and Superman descends to the ground. The new Batman VS Superman trailer was leaked online a few days ago, following which an HD version arrived officially only a day later. "Is it really surprising that the most powerful man in the world should be a figure of controversy?" says a voiceover as the trailer begins. As with most first trailers (which are really teasers), there is very little information, but plenty to get fans worked up! There are some pretty cool shots of the new batmobile, batwing and even the first official footage of Ben Affleck as Bruce Wayne. What's almost indecipherable is the premise Superman finds himself in two years from where 'Man of Steel' left off, in the teaser, we see a statue built in his honour in Metropolis where he saved mankind from Zod, but with 'Fake God' written in big red letters across the sign of hope, Superman's family crest. First video glances at Aquaman and Wonderwoman are yet to come. The trailer is just that, a teaser for a film that doesn't come out for another eleven months and still has plenty of post-production work left to go. As such, it shouldn't necessarily be held to the thrill-spilling standards of Ant Man, Mission: Impossible Ghost Protocol, or even the second teaser trailer for Star Wars: The Force Awakens. It is basically an announcement teaser, and as such leaves pretty much everything but the big picture up in the air.

crosses 90 million views

Wiz Khalifa's chart topping number 'See You Again', created as original soundtrack for the 2015 action film Furious 7 (in theatres now) has crossed 90 million views on YouTube. The song also features the vocals and piano playing of American singer Charlie Puth on the hook. The song is featured in Furious 7 as a final tribute to Paul Walker, who died in a car crash in November 2013. The single was released on March 17, 2015 in the US, followed by an international release on April 3. The song holds the record for the most-streamed track in a single day on Spotify in the United States (streamed 4.2 million times on April 13, 2015), and also set the record for most streams in a single week in 26 countries during April 6 to April 12. "See You Again" was a huge international success, reaching Billboard number one position in fourteen countries, including the US. In the film, the song gets played at the end of the film during which Furious 7 characters, Brian O'Conner and Dominic Toretto drive their cars on a mountain road and eventually part ways when they reach a fork, giving Brian a poignant retirement send-off in which he'd be living with his wife and raising a family
