#### Animated Spider-Man in 2018

Spider-Man is going back to his graphic roots. On Thursday, Sony announced a new animated feature for the Marvel superhero from "The Lego Movie" directors Phil Lord and Chris Miller. The movie hits theaters July 20, 2018.

Lord and Miller, the filmmaking duo behind "22 Jump Street" and "Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs", will write the treatment and produce the

Sony Pictures chairman Tom Rothman made the disclosure at CinemaCon in Las Vegas. Rothman said the film will "co-exist" with the live-action Spiderman universe, but the press



release clarifies: "The film will exist independently of the projects in the liveaction Spider-Man universe, all of which are continuing."

Rothman did not, however, reveal any news on the live-action "Spider-Man" from Marvel's Cinematic Universe that will debut on July 28, 2017. Marvel's Kevin Feige and Sony's Pascal will produce that movie, which will feature the Peter Parker iteration of the web-slinger.

Spidey will make his next film appearance in Marvel's "Captain America: Civil War", which bows May 6, 2016.

Her dance video, "Pothikrit", is especially designed for International Dance Day 2015, by Turongomi Repertory Dance Theatre.

With concept, choreography, screenplay, direction and performance by Srimonti Pooja Sengupta, Azimul Haque Arzu was the DOP for the piece.

"Through this video I would like to pay my deep homage to 10 internationally acclaimed dancers-choreographers whom I think are my pioneers: Luie Fuller, Martha Graham, Moris Petipa, Rabindranath Tagore, Rukmini Devi Arundale, Uday Shankar, Bulbul Chowdhury, Birju Maharaj and Akram Khan. The video will go on air on April 29 on TV channels, social media and internet," said Pooja Sengupta.

Pooja Sengupta is a promising dancer-choreographer who runs Turongomi Repertory Dance Theatre. She is an ICCR scholar, who has also donned lead roles in two Tagore dance dramas -"Chitrangada" and "Chandalika", both directed by her guru Shukla Sarkar.

She was paid 1 million USD for her role in "Selena" in 1997. Lopez's second album, JLo, was released on January 23, 2001 and it was an instant hit. She is also the first actress to have a movie and an album hit number one in the same week. J.Lo earned 15 million USD for her role in 2005's "Monster-in-Law", making her the highest paid Latina

actress in Hollywood at

the time.

#### AVENGERS: AGE OF ULTRON opens to \$201.2 million at foreign box office

"Avengers: Age of Ultron" debuted to a massive \$201.2 million across 44 territories this weekend.

Disney and Marvel's super team adventure was the highest-grossing film in everywhere it opened, and has now rolled out in 55% of the international marketplace, including such major locales as France, Italy, Germany, the United Kingdom, Russia, Korea and Australia.

Going into the weekend, Disney was projecting a foreign debut of between \$160 million to \$175 mil-


"The bar was high, but this is a sign of unbelievable momentum in the marketplace," said Dave Hollis, Disney's distribution chief. "It all goes back to the strength of the brand and the incredible work the Marvel team does in telling stories in such a consistent way and creating these worlds."

The hotly anticipated superhero sequel opens next week in the US, where it is expected to earn north of \$200 million and could top the first "Avengers" film's record-breaking \$207.4 million bow. Bringing Thor, Iron Man, Captain America, Hulk and co. together isn't cheap, and "Avengers: Age of Ultron" carries a

\$250 million price-tag. The success of "Avengers: Age of Ultron" is a testament to the strength of the global market, which now accounts for 70% or more of a major film's box office gross. Two decades ago, foreign ticket sales usually comprised less than half of a movie's reve-


Enthusiasm for the film gave Imax the largest international opening in its history, not counting China, with the \$10.4 million of "Avengers: Age of Ultron" gross coming from the widescreen locations. In a sign of the Imax's popularity when it comes to comic book titles, its newly opened Denmark theatre, its first venue in Scandinavia, did a staggering \$172,000 on one screen.

While the music for the 1957 film "Aasha" was composed by C Ramchandra, Kishore Kumar and Asha Bhosle lent their voices to the original song.

It is said that its lyrics were inspired by kids who were chanting the nursery rhyme, 'Eeny, meeny, miny, moe' outside the musician's studio when the song was being composed. That chant inspired Ramchandra and his assistant, John Gomes to compose the first line — "Eena meena deeka, de dai damanika" — of the song. Gomes added the words "Maka naka".

The new version has been composed by Mikey McCleary, who is known for his remixes of classic Bollywood songs. The video was shot during the course of the film's schedule
