




'We can score 600 and take 20 scalps'

By the looks of it Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president Nazmul Hasan Papon is the most advertised

person in Khulna. If you move along the Jessore Road (Khan A Sabur Road) or the KDA Road, the two most prominent roads in Khulna, you will find life-size pictures of the BCB boss from arches and billboards to the posters.

He is a lawmaker but not from Khulna. However, had there been an election in this part of Bangladesh, he probably could have scored a landslide victory.

But he is actually aware of the fact that his popularity hinges on how the Tigers perform on the field. It has been so far so good against Pakistan. And ahead of the first Test both his coach Chandika Hathurusingha and captain Mushfiqur Rahim said that they want to start with a victory at the back of their mind

They might not sound as pragmatic as Shakib Al Hasan the other day, but they were certainly ambitious in a format that needs discipline in the mental makeup of the players and a good set of bowlers to take 20 wickets against a side that have recently beaten Australia and New Zealand.

"Pakistan are really strong with experienced players in their Test

squad. They beat Australia recently, they are ranked four. It is good for us to play a strong opposition at this stage because we are also doing well," Hathurusingha told reporters yesterday.

"It is a different format but still, when you do well you get confident. You trust your preparation. That's the confidence that we are taking to the game. It doesn't mean we are overcon-



fident. It is all about first session tomorrow (Tuesday).

"Our expectation is to win every series. We don't take the opposition for granted or be overconfident. We try to do our best and if we do that, I think we have the ability to beat any team," said the confident Sri Lankan.

"The three new guys are in the squad on merit. Few of them will get a chance immediately even though the team is doing well. One thing I want to cultivate is to give a player a decent run. "We have been playing good cricket for quite some time. We beat Zimbabwe in the last session of a Test, which is something very inspiring for us. I hope we will be able to play good cricket in the next five days,"said Mushfigur, adding that if his side starts with a mindset of a draw then it will limit the area of thinking for both bowlers and batsmen.

Step up or step down, says Afridi

Pakistan's T20 captain and seasoned all-rounder Shahid Afridi has said that senior members of the national cricket team should either step up their game or step down themselves to give a chance to new budding players.

Following an unimpressive performance during the World Cup and the sole T20 International match played between Pakistan and Bangladesh, the mercurial all-rounder offered to retire from all formats of the game saying he 'did not want to be a burden for the team'.

The 34-year-old had recently bowed out of ODIs with his dreams unfulfilled as Pakistan crashed out in the 2015 World Cup quarterfinals against Australia.

His comments follow Pakistan's 0-3 ODI whitewash, and a loss in the only T20 international played during the ongoing tour of Bangladesh.

He had earlier called upon fans to be patient during the team's 'rebuilding' phase.

Following the drubbing of the Green-shirts at the hands of Bangladesh, Pakistan cricket has been said to be at it at its lowest ebb in international history with Chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Shahryar Khan admitting that the country's entire cricketing structure was flawed.

Misbah looks to break Tigers' confidence

Despite the barrage of queries related to the ODI debacle, Misbah managed to remain focused on his main agenda: the first Test set to begin at Khulna today.

"There is always pressure in international cricket and obviously when the opposition is playing good you have to be at your best. We are aware of them and we have to respect the opposition as they are good at their

home condition and have been highly confident since the World Cup.

"Our focus will be on our strengths. We have to concentrate on our basics. It's important for us to break the confidence of the Bangladesh team and for that we have to play our best cricket," believes Misbah.

Pakistan will hope that the return of Younis Khan and Misbah will bolster their batting attack, which has struggled in the last few weeks. The visitors failed to excel in the three ODIs and the sole T20I on good batting wickets. Their totals were gobbled in a hurry by the hosts and they barely displayed a fighting spirit.

Their bowlers failed to live up to the expectations as well and were dispatched by Bangladesh's youngsters. The manner in which young Sabbir Rahman powered in those boundaries against the experienced Wahab Riaz, was a scene, that Bangladesh's fans were not used to before.

However, the visitors can gain encouragement from the way they performed in the last few Tests. Pakistan have won four out of their last five Tests and those wins came against Australia and New Zealand. Misbah is confident that his side can carry on the good work. "The Test side is quite experienced. We

have been performing consistently for quite a long while now. It's a different ball game and these players have a better understanding of Test cricket. Everybody is in good shape and in the best of forms.

"Also the condition here is similar to Abu Dhabi and Dubai and we hope to carry on the form we have in this format," he added.
