FOOD POISONING

40 policemen fall sick in C'nawabganj

Forty policemen, including two officers-in-charge (OC) of Sadar Model Police Station in Chapainawabganj town, fell sick after having lunch on Monday.

charge (investigation), said a daylong workshop was held at the police station on the day, in which 40 policemen participated. At noon, the policemen were given packet lunch from local Alauddin Hotel. In the evening, all of them started vomiting and got

diarrhea. Six of the policemen, including one sub-inspector and three women constables, were admitted to Chapainawabganj Adhunik Sadar Hospital, while the rest given first aid. Dr Benzir Ahmed, acting resident medical officer

(RMO) of Sadar Hospital, said the cops fell sick after having poisonous food. Sub-Inspector Abdus Sabur, duty officer of the police station, said they detained six people, including the owner of the hotel, for quizzing yesterday.

10 injured as AL, Jubo League men clash

At least ten people were injured in a clash between the activists of Awami League (AL) and Jubo League in the town on Monday night.

Locals said two groups—one led by AL leader Anis of Akua Morolpara area and the other by Jubo League leader Shahinor of adjacent Ramkrishna Mission Road area—locked in a clash at around 11:00pm over control of Ramkrishna Mission Road area, leaving at least ten people from both sides injured.

They used sharp weapons and blasted crude bombs during the clash that continued for an hour.

Of the injured, two were admitted to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital while the rest given first aid.

Being informed, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. They later arrested five Jubo League men from Akua Morolpara area for their alleged involvement in the clash.

Contacted, Officer-in-Charge Abu Mohammad Fazlul Karim of Sadar Police Station said the arrestees were yesterday produced in a court that sent them to jail.

Garment worker saved from kidnap bid

A female garment worker escaped an abduction attempt in the town on Monday night, thanks to the prompt action by the district superintendent of police (SP).

Shikha Akter, a worker of a garment factory in Chittagong city, was returning to her home at Maishadi village under Chandpur Sadar upazila when the two youths waylaid her on the road around 11:30pm.

"On the way to my resi-

dence near the Circuit House, I saw two youths on a motor-bike intercepting a rickshaw carrying the girl, aged around 18. They were trying to force the rickshaw-puller to go to the Bus Stand area," said SP Md Ameer Jafar.

"I rushed to the spot and took the two youths and the girl to my office nearby," he said.

The two youths, Joyanal Abedin Gazi, son of Kalu Gazi of Ronggaon village, and Abdus Shahid Sujon, son of Abdus Sattar Patwary of Madna village in Sadar upazila,

were later sent to the police station by a patrol team.

The SP informed the girl's father Shukkur Ali and handed her over to him after recording her statement.

The girl's father filed a case in connection with the kidnap attempt yesterday morning, said Enayet Uddin, officer-in-charge of Chandpur Model Police Station.

In the afternoon, the two youths were produced before the court that turned down their bail prayer and sent them to jail.

Police yet to unearth clue to murder of ex-army man

Police are yet to unearth clue to the murder of an ex-army man in Dumki upazila of the district.

Mohammad Jamal Hossain Sikder, 45, son of late Abul Hossain Sikder of Kartikpasha village, in the upazila, was found murdered at the village on April 20.

Masud Sikder, brother of the victim, filed a murder

case with Dumki Police Station, accusing an unidentified gang the same day, said Habibur Rahman, officer-in-charge of the police station.

Police interrogated eight people, including victim's wife Ferdousy Akhter, a school-teacher, and their daughter Nusrat Jahan alias Maria, but they could not identify the killers and unearth the motive behind the killing.

According to the case statement, Jamal went out of

his house around 9:00pm on April 19 and did not return. Next morning, locals spotted his body lying in a farmland and informed the police.

Police recovered the body and sent it to Patuakhali General Hospital morgue for autopsy. Quoting victim's family members, police said there had been a long-standing rivalry between Jamal and his neighbours over the ownership of a disputed land.

Man hurt in Benapole clash dies

Death toll rises to three

A man, who sustained critical injuries in a clash between two groups of villagers at Raghunathpur village in Benapole of Jessore on April 24, died at a hospital in the capital on Monday night.

The deceased is Asgar Ali, 58, son of Sagir Uddin of the village. With the death of Asgar, the number of people killed in the clash rose to three.

On April 24, two people were killed and at least four others injured as two groups of villagers clashed over cutting of a fallen tree at the village, said Benapole police Officer in-Charge Apurba Hasan.

The deceased are Md Abdullah, 52, former member of Bahadurpur Union Parishad, and Shamsur Rahman, 40, son of Khalilur Rahman of the village. Injured Sumon, 23, Asgar Ali, 58, M Abdullah, 35, and

Hafizur Rahman, 35, were admitted to Jessore Medical College Hospital and Sharsha Burujagan Hospital. Of them, Asgar was later shifted to a private hospital in Dhaka as his condition deteriorated.

Police said Abdullah was attacked by a group, led by one Nasir Uddin and Alauddin, with sharp weapons as he tried to prevent them from taking away a roadside tree that was uprooted during a storm the previous night.

Following the attack, two groups of villagers locked in a clash that left Abdullah and Shamsur dead on the spot.

On information, police went to the spot and brought the situation under control. They also detained two villagers named Giasuddin and Abdur Rahman for their alleged involvement in the attack, the OC added.

Mugger held after gunfight with cops

An alleged mugger sustained bullet injuries in a 'gunfight' between his cohorts and police at Ramchandrapur intersection in Sadar upazila early Monday.

Injured Siddique Tarafdar, son of Golam Tarafdar of Dhamalia village in Dumuria upazila of Khulna, is now undergoing treatment at Satkhira Sadar Hospital.

Sub-inspector Kamal Hossain, also information officer of Satkhira police, said a gang snatched Tk 1.5 lakh from one Habibur Rahman near Keshtamoira intersection in the town on Sunday noon.

Locals caught Siddique

while he was fleeing with Tk 50 thousand and handed him over to the police. The other members of the gang managed to flee the scene.

According to his confessional statement, police took Siddique to Ramchandrapur area to arrest his cohorts and recover the rest of the looted money around 12:30am.

Sensing the presence of the police, his accomplices opened fire, prompting the law enforcers to retaliate.

Siddique received bullet in his left leg during the 'shootout', the SI said, adding that two policemen were also injured.

Police arrested bullet-hit Siddique and recovered a cartridge and a machete from the spot.
