

# Tk 97,000cr ADP okayed

Next fiscal year's development budget 29pc bigger than this year's revised one


The government has increased the size of the Annual Development Programme (ADP) for the next fiscal year by more than 29 percent although that of the current fiscal remains largely unused.

The National Economic Council (NEC) yesterday approved Tk 97,000 crore ADP for FY 2015-16, with an additional Tk 3,997 crore allocation for the autonomous state-owned enterprises, which will implement the projects through their own financing.

This means, the overall development expenditure in the next fiscal year would stand at Tk 1,00,997 crore, said Planning Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal after the NEC meeting at his ministry yesterday.

The initial size of the ADP in the current fiscal was Tk 80,315 crore but it was later slashed to Tk 75,000 crore. However, only 56 percent of the revised ADP has been spent in the first 10 months of the current FY.

For the next fiscal, the planning ministry initially proposed Tk 92,500 crore ADP but considering the demand of other ministries, Prime minister Sheikh Hasina, who SEE PAGE 17 COL 3

# Cheated in Brunei

22 Bangladeshi jobseekers return home penniless, accuse recruiting agencies of fraud

Twenty-two Bangladeshi workers, who were lured allegedly by two manpower recruiting agencies into going Brunei for lucrative jobs, yesterday returned home empty-handed.

"The two agencies took Tk 4.5 lakh to Tk 5 lakh from each of us, promising to provide gardening jobs in Brunei with a monthly salary of Tk 30,540. But, we got the jobs of labourers there and earned only the half every month," Jewel Rana, one of the returnees, told The Daily Star yesterday.

The 22 Bangladeshis arrived in Dhaka on a Malaysia Airlines flight around 12:30am. Later in the morning, they went straight to the expatriates' welfare and overseas employment ministry and registered their

complaints against the agencies there.

They blamed the agencies for cheating them with false promises of lucrative salaries and demanded compensation.

According to them, a total of 34 Bangladeshis went to Brunei through the two agencies in February. Of them, only four are still in that country.

"There was no scope for working overtime in the company in Brunei. The agencies had promised us that we would be able to work for at least extra two hours. There was no weekly day offs either," said Jewel, who hailed from Faridpur.

He said they approached their Brunei employer repeatedly for getting the facilities "mentioned" in their work contracts but SEE PAGE 17 COL 6

# Ex-AL lawmaker, wife cleared

A Dhaka court yesterday cleared former Awami League lawmaker Khan Tipu Sultan, his wife Jesmine Ara Begum and son Humayun Sultan Shahdat of Dr Shamarukh Mahjabin's murder. Wife of Shahdat, Shamarukh was found hanging from her apartment

window in the capital's Dhanmondi on November 13 last year. She was sent to a hospital where physicians declared her dead. Metropolitan Magistrate Ashoke Kumar Dutt passed the order after scrutinising two autopsy reports and other relevant documents in the mur-

der case. He accepted the final report in the case and cleared the three accused of the murder charge. However, Shamarukh's family rejected the CID's probe report and said

they will file an appeal with the higher court seeking cancellation of the lower court's order.
