Security guard killed in Ashulia, two warehouses looted

A night-time security guard was killed and readymade garment products worth around Tk 20 lakh were looted from two warehouses at Gazirchot in Ashulia, outside the capital, early yesterday.

Abdus Sattar, 55, of Naogaon suffered several cuts on different parts of his body.

Ashulia police suspect that he was hacked as he tried to resist robbers in Sonia Market area.

In the morning, locals found the body with the hands and feet tied with rope. Police sent it to the Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy. A case was filed.

14 electricity connections cut off for not paying bills in Ctg

A mobile court of Power Development Board (PDB) in Chittagong city yesterday disconnected 14 electricity connections of 11 consumers and filed 11 cases against them for having Tk 24 lakh arrear bills.

The court led by Senior Judicial Magistrate Mohammad Mohiuddin conducted a daylong drive in Madarbari, DT Road, Kadamtoli, Dhaniala Para, and Darogahat Road areas under Madarbari distribution zone of PDB and disconnected the electricity lines.

Man hacked to death in Sylhet

A man was hacked to death by miscreants in Custghar Sweeper colony area of Sylhet city on Saturday.

Shikander Lal, 30, was a cleaner of Jaflong Bazar area.

He came to visit his relatives in the area when miscreants killed him around 9:00pm, police said.

However, they could not find the reason behind the death.

The body was sent to Osmani Medical College Hospital for an autopsy.

Muggers kill truck driver in Tongi

Muggers killed a truck driver and looted his money and mobile phone in Bastuhara area of Tongi, outside the capital, yesterday.

Police said four muggers swooped on Bulbul Ahmed, 26, of Bogra when he parked the vehicle as his helper went to bring betel leaf from a tea stall around 3:30am.

They stabbed Bulbul as he tried to resist them and fled with the loot. Locals rushed Bulbul to Tongi Government Hospital where doctors declared him dead.

PAHELA BAI SHAKH MASS MOLESTATION Responsibility of govt for deterrence stressed again

Referring to police failures to arrest the Pahela Baishakh molesters, Gono Songhoti Andolon Convener Zonayed Saki yesterday alleged that the incidence of sexual assault was increasing in the country because the government lacked accountability.

"Molesting females has been a common phenomenon in all festivals," he told a rally of 12 left-leaning student organisations under the banner of Progotishil Chhatra Jote and Shamrajjobad Birodhi Chhatra Oikya at the capital's Shabbagh.

Bazlur Rashid Firoz, leader of Bangladesher Samajtantrik Dal, said the High Court had ordered the education institutions to create anti-harassment cells but no one complied. "At the educational institutions, sexual assault is increasing and schoolgirls cannot escape it; the government must take the responsibility," he said.

Resilience: Role of Multi-stakeholder Collaboration", the workshop was jointly organised by the International Centre for Climate Change and Development (ICCCAD), and Urban for Humanity in the capital's The Daily Star Centre.

Climate change hazards like waterlogging and heat stress, coupled with poor water and sanitation services, led to waterborne diseases like diarrhoea, cholera, dysentery, skin diseases and pneumonia, said Sarder Shafiqul Alam, principal researcher, ICCCAD, while presenting the research findings.

The government did not have any mechanism to monitor 57 non-government organisations' activities in Dhaka slums while the latter were not able to provide long-term services for the policy's absence, he added.

The presentation also pointed out that Dhaka experienced nine major floods in the last 60 years.

ICCCAD Director Dr Saleemul Huq moderated the session, chaired by Habitat for Humanity National Director John A Armstrong.

Khondaker Fowze Muhammed Bin Farid, director, Urban Development Directorate, Ministry of Housing and Public Works, was present as the guest speaker while different organisations' representatives also attend.

two JP-backed candidates in Dhaka, she said, "The defeated candidates always make such complaints."

Raushan said her party had been taking part in all elections after 1990, braving oppression.

Replying to a query over the killing of bloggers, she said, "It is not right to kill someone. If they do something condemnable, they should be brought to trial."

The former first lady also dismissed speculations that she was having differences of opinions with her husband and party chairman HM Ershad. "Both of us are working for the welfare of the party," she said. "Some media report this [disagreement], but the people don't believe it."

Asked about BNP leader Salahuddin Ahmed, she said it was good news that he was found. Let him come; all will know what had happened to him, she added.

She expressed her concern over the sexual harassment of females during the Pahela Baishakh celebrations and demanded immediate arrest of the molesters.

The opposition leader also thanked India's government, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and the Bangladesh government for India's ratifying the long-pending land boundary agreement.

They also picked up Hannan Chowdhury, Abdul Hay and four or five others from the market and released them after torture, he said, adding that his brother was taken to Netrakona sadar and kept confined in the district resthouse.

Siddiqur said his uncles Bhulu Miah and Saru Miah requested Taher's father Manjurul Haque to release his brother but was denied.

Siddiqur said on the following day they heard that Taher and Nani killed his brother taking him near Netrakona Trimohini Bridge and they did not find the body.

The three-member tribunal led by Justice M Enayetur Rahim adjourned proceedings until today after counsels of Taher and Nani completed cross-examining Fazlul.
