

### Efforts to stop misuse of ADP funds

The government plans to take strict measures to streamline the implementation of the Annual Development Programme (ADP) projects and stop misuse of funds.

Planning Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal conveyed the government's message to all secretaries yesterday, saying that 25 percent of the ADP will have to be implemented in the first quarter of the fiscal year and no projects will be revised more than twice.

The planning minister's directive follows the National Economic Council's approval of a record Tk 97,000 crore development programme last week.

ADP implementation remains sluggish at the beginning of a fiscal year, only to gain sudden speed at the end of the year.

# Connectivity key to higher growth

Analysts say at a global meeting on post-2015 development agenda

Developing countries should stop running after low-hanging fruits but rather develop connectivity among them to promote sustainable development, analysts said yesterday.

"South-South cooperation is possible, and it can be built through multimodal connectivity such as physical connectivity and ICT," said Sultan Hafeez Rahman, executive director of the Institute of Governance Studies at Brac University.

"If we can do that, it will ultimately spur

economic growth in developing countries and lift billions of people out of poverty," he said.

For example, if all South Asian countries have road connectivity, it would add 1.5 percent to the region's gross domestic product, said the former senior official of the Asian Development Bank.

Foreign Secretary Shahidul Haque said connectivity alone can raise GDP growth by percent in Thailand, Vietnam and Myanmar and 2.5 percent in India.

"They will achieve this output growth without doing anything additional," he said. READ MORE ON B3

#### Tax receipts improve in March

Tax collection improved in March with economic activities regaining pace as the violent political situation gradually subsided.

Revenue receipts rose 18.30 percent to Tk 12,750 crore in March from Tk 10,778 crore a year ago, according to data from the National Board of Revenue.

Collection had slowed in February as businesses suffered in the wake of violent blockades and repeated strikes, enforced by the BNPled alliance since January 6.




