PM paid toll, mayor didn't

*Khokon wants free ride
on Hanif Flyover*

Dhaka South City Corporation on Tuesday had issued a letter to the Mayor Mohammad Hanif Flyover authorities, asking them to make sure the flyover is made toll-free for newly elected mayor Sayeed Khokon.

The letter was issued hours after Khokon along with a convoy of vehicles refused to pay the toll while travelling on the flyover around 11:55am that day.

An altercation ensued between the mayor's men and the flyover staff at a toll plaza at the Postogola end.

In the face of abusive words and threats by the mayor's men, the flyover staff, at one stage, had to let the convoy go, said city corporation sources.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, while inaugurating the flyover on October 11, 2013, paid toll for her car, saying all would have to pay toll for using the flyover.

However, the city corporation authorities, on the mayor's instruction, on Wednesday issued another letter retracting their earlier letter, sources at the city corporation said.

Terming the incident "trivial", Sayeed Khokon on Wednesday told The Daily Star, "The accompanying boys started shouting at the flyover staffs, as they [flyover staff] stopped my car though they had allowed the security vehicle to go toll-free."

Fifa scam widens

Blatter defiant amid calls to quit as crisis polarises world; Putin accuses US of meddling as West demands change

The corruption charges engulfing soccer's governing body have heaped shame and humiliation on the game, Fifa President Sepp Blatter said yesterday, although he flatly rejected calls to resign over the scandal.

With Fifa facing the worst crisis in its 111-year history, Michel Platini, who heads Europe's soccer confederation UEFA, said he had told Blatter to go "with tears in my eyes", but the 79-year-old had refused.

"I said, 'I'm asking you to leave, Fifa's image is terrible.' He said that he couldn't leave all of a sudden," Platini, a former French international, told reporters.

In a bullish speech opening a FIFA Congress in Zurich, Blatter said the turbulence of the last two days, which included the arrest of leading soccer officials at their luxury Swiss hotel, had brought "shame and humiliation" to world soccer.

Making his first public appearance since Wednesday's dramatic events, which were triggered by a US-led investigation into allegations of rampant bribe-taking, Blatter said there was no room "for corruption of any kind".

"The events of yesterday have cast a long shadow over football and this Congress," said Blatter, who is standing for a fifth mandate as Fifa president in today's election, where Prince Ali bin Al Hussein of Jordan is his only challenger.

*Secular blogger fears after
murder of three others*

A Bangladeshi blogger whose name is on a "hit-list" of secular writers drawn up by Islamist extremists fears he will be the next to die after three others were hacked to death.

Ananya Azad's own father survived a machete attack in 2004 after he wrote a critique of fundamentalism and he is now being threatened for his own work.

In the wake of the latest murder of Ananta Bijoy Das on May 12, Ananya Azad told the Guardian that he received a threatening Facebook message saying: "You would be the next person. So be careful."

"Anyone who has a critical view about religion is exposed," he said. "I probably have reduced my frequency of writing but my nature of writing has not changed."

'Rapists' bragged about their crime

*Says witness in Kuril rape case,
2 suspects on 10-day remand*

The duo who raped a girl in a running microbus in the capital's Kuril area on May 21 bragged about the crime the next day, a witness in the case told a magistrate yesterday.

The "rapists"-- Ashraf Khan alias Tushar and Jahidul Islam Lavlu -- were drivers at a garment buying house in Gulshan.

In a statement before Metropolitan Magistrate SM Masud Zaman, witness Mohammad Khokon, a fellow driver at the buying house, said he had heard the two describing the rape of the indigenous girl to some others at their office on May 22, court sources said.

Two other witnesses, Mahbub Hossain, a security guard at a building in Banani where Tushar's employer lives, and Nur Alam also gave statements yesterday.

Mahbub in his statement before Metropolitan Magistrate Hasibul Haque said he had seen Tushar driving out of the building around 8:00 in the night of May 21.

While leaving the building, Tushar told him that he would return in 10 minutes. But he came back around

'Drug peddler'

'Auschwitz bookkeeper' tells



The trial of a former SS guard has heard how the Nazis used a lethal pesticide to slowly and painfully kill over one million victims of the Holocaust.

Oskar Groening, now 93, a former accountant at Auschwitz, is on trial in Luneburg, Germany, for his involvement in the deaths of 300,000 Hungarian Jews at a Nazi camp in Poland in 1944.
