
YELLOW FOR REF!

MESSI'S magical moment

Lionel Messi changed last night's Copa del Rey final in 13 seconds on Saturday night with what will most likely go down as the goal of the season. Another majestic performance from Lionel Messi put Barcelona on the brink of becoming the first team ever to win the treble twice as they put Athletic Bilbao to the sword 3-1.

And just as with Guardiola's sides, the catalyst has been Messi, with the addition of Neymar and Luis Suarez allowing him the extra freedom needed to be even more deadly.

The Argentine struck twice, including a sensational individ-



ual effort to open the scoring, either side of Neymar's tap in. Messi's moment of magic came in the 20th minute.

Messi collected the ball at the half-way line and stopped for a second, before making his move. As Messi dribbled forward, Mikel Balenziaga, Mikel Rico and Benat Etxebarria blocked his route towards goal. However, Messi dribbled through them like they weren't there, with trademark feints and a nutmeg, before turning inside Aymeric Laporte and smashing the ball in Iago Herrin's near post.

Even by the Argentine's incredibly high standards the move and finish was as good as any of his previous 410 Barca goals.

"We're used to this Messi. We're lucky to enjoy him every day in training, when we see him wriggle away from three challenges before shooting. His first goal was from another galaxy," Luis Enrique said.

I won't change: Neymar

Brazilian star Neymar has insisted he won't be bullied into curbing his repertoire of skills after a host of Athletic Bilbao players reacted angrily

to his show-boating towards the end of Barcelona's 3-1 Copa del Rey final win on Saturday.

Neymar flicked the ball over Unai Bustinza with both feet with two minutes to go and Barca well on their way to sealing a 27th Copa del Rey to go with the La Liga title they won two weeks ago.

Bilbao's outraged players immediately surrounded the 22-year-old with Barca's veteran captain Xavi Hernandez having to lead his teammate away from the fracas.

"They can be angry, but it is my way of playing and I have done so for years. Just because others get angry doesn't mean I am going to change my style of play," said Neymar.

However, Barca boss Luis Enrique had strong words for his star.

"In Spain this is looked on very badly. If I was an Athletic player I would have reacted

the same, or even worse," said Enrique. "In Brazil this is normal, so we have to

understand the context. He didn't do it to humiliate his opponent, it is difficult to explain it when someone is losing but we will try to control it with time."

Athletic coach Ernesto Valverde also claimed Neymar needs to learn that such gestures will not be tolerated in Spain.

"It is not even looked upon well by his own fans," he said.

"When the game is won we are very well aware to maintain certain respect for the opponent. There are things that he will learn with time."

The incident took the shine off another brilliant display for Barca, and in particular Messi, that leaves them just one game away from sealing a treble.

Enrique's men face Juventus in the Champions League final and will be strong favourites with the Messi in such form. And Athletic captain Andoni Iraola

believes Neymar could also learn from the attitude shown by Messi. "For me it didn't seem elegant or sporting

at all," said the 32-year-old, who was playing his final game for the Basques.

"He has examples in his own team that he should pay attention to because he has much to learn from them."



Klopp's bitter end



Jurgen Klopp says leaving Borussia Dortmund is the 'hardest moment of his career' after losing the German Cup final with the charismatic coach now unemployed and

weighing up his future. Dortmund were denied the fairytale farewell at Berlin's Olympic Stadium as Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang's early strike was cancelled out by three goals in 16 firsthalf minutes as Wolfsburg claimed a 3-1 victory on Saturday.

This was Klopp's final bow after seven years as Thomas Tuchel takes over next season. His farewell party in East Berlin went on until just before 0500 local time on

Sunday.

"This is here and now my hardest

moment," Klopp told guests at his party. "The pain of saying goodbye is building slowly and it really hurts. I have tried to express my thanks to each player, because it has been to me an extraordinary pleasure, a great honour to work with them and I find it hard to let go.

"The disappointment from the defeat is huge, but it was a fitting final."

Dortmund fans chanted Klopp's name after the final whistle, but he said it was little comfort.

"It was a great thing to hear, but was little consolation after the defeat. We've grown together over the years, but it wasn't any comfort. When you have wanted something so badly, you need a moment to gather yoursel," concluded Klopp.

Rafa confirmed by accident!



Real Madrid vice-president Eduardo Fernandez de Blas has unwittingly unveiled the expected appointment of Rafael Benitez as the club's new coach at a fans' meeting.

De Blas let slip Benitez's arrival when questioned by angry supporters why the Italian had been let go.

"Carlo Ancelotti is a phenomenon. We thank him. Until three days ago for me he was the best coach in the world, just like two years ago Jose Mourinho was and starting from next week Rafael Benitez will be," De Blas was recorded as saying. Benitez confirmed last week that he will leave Napoli after their crucial clash against Lazio. However, many of the Madrid faithful remain unconvinced because of his inability to deliver a league title for 11 years ago now.

Kiwis fight back

BJ Watling became the first New Zealand batsman to score a Test century at Headingley as the tourists eyed a series-levelling victory over England on Sunday.

Watling's 100 not out took New Zealand to 338 for six in their second innings at stumps on the third day, with their lead also

338 after both sides made first innings totals of exactly 350. batsman only in this match after he injured his knee keeping wicket at Lord's, went to

his hundred in just under three hours off 136 balls, including 13 fours and a six, when he hooked James Anderson down to long leg for a single.

It was the 29-year-old Watling's fifth hundred in just 31 Tests and his first against England.

It meant England would have to rewrite the record books were they to win this match and take the series 2-0 after their 124run victory in the first Test at Lord's.

The most any England side have made to win in the fourth innings of a Test is the 332 for seven they posted against Australia at Melbourne back in 1928/29.

Earlier, Stuart Broad proved a thorn in the South Africa-born Watling, playing as a side of New Zealand with both bat and ball early on the third day. Broad's 46 helped England make 350. He then took two wickets for four runs in 12 balls, with Tom Latham and Kane Williamson both caught behind before the Kiwis fought back.
