

Mother's death made me a musician: **BONO**

U2 frontman Bono says the death of his mother, when he was just 14, inspired him to turn a professional musician and form the popular Irish rock band. The 55-year-old artist's mother died from a brain aneurysm in September 1974 and the singer admits losing her left a "hole" in his heart, reported Female First. "I realised aged 14, when my mother suddenly passed away at her own father's graveside, that I had a hole in my heart." To deal with his grief, Bono turned to music and that turned into his life. "I didn't know at the time, as I filled it with music. I became an artist through her absence and I owe her for that. I thought the rage I had was a part of rock 'n' roll but the rage was grief." Bono has often written about his mother's death in U2 songs, dealing with his feelings on tracks such as "I Will Follow", "Mofo" and "Out of Control".

Joins Sci-Fi Pic 'Rupture' To Torment Noomi Rapace

Michael Chiklis has joined the cast of Rupture, the Steven Shainberg-directed sci-fi thriller starring Noomi Rapace that is the next project of American Sniper producer Andrew Lazar. The pic centers on a single mother (Rapace) struggling to raise her 12-year-old son alone who is abducted by a mysterious organization. Tied up in their lab, they question her about her medical history, eventually revealing that she has a genetic abnormality that her worst fear can cause her to "rupture" — causing her own alien nature to be released. It's based on a story by Shainberg and Brian Nelson, and Nelson (Hard Candy, 30 Days Of Night) wrote the screenplay. Chiklis will play The Bald Man, the entity's powerful point man who directs the mother's violent capture.

WILLIAM SHATNER could play Captain Kirk again: Simon Pegg



Actor-filmmaker Simon Pegg says William Shatner could play Captain Kirk in a future "Star Trek" film. Pegg, 45, is currently co-writing the third movie since the reboot of the franchise and will also reprise his role as Scotty, reported Digital Spy. Shatner did not feature in "Star Trek" or "Star Trek Into Darkness", but has been tipped for a role in the third movie. His original series co-star Leonard Nimoy, who passed away earlier this year, appeared in both. Pegg said the title of the film - rumoured to be "Star Trek Beyond" - was still "all to play for". The writer also dismissed reports that he had been brought on the project to make it "less Star Trek-y".

'San Andreas' brings back bad memories: DWAYNE JOHNSON

Dwayne Johnson says he has no problem channelling the sense of family and drama in his upcoming blockbuster movie "San Andreas" because he has lived through similar life-or-death moments.
