

ATTACK ON HINDUS AT KORNAI OF DINAJPUR

Charges pressed against 89 Jamaat-Shibir, BNP men

Eighty-nine men belonging to Jamaat-Shibir and BNP have been charge-sheeted in two cases in connection with the attack on Hindus at Kornai village in Dinajpur Sadar upazila during the 10th parliamentary elections on January 5 last year.

Md Tariqul Islam and Manik Reza, inspectors of Criminal Investigation Department (CID) of Dinajpur, filed the charge sheets separately with the

court of Senior Judicial Magistrate Md Nazmul Hossain on May 31.

First hearing of the case was held yesterday.

A few of the key accused, now hiding, are Anisur Rahman Badsha, 37, chairman of Chehelgazi Union Parishad (UP) in Dinajpur Sadar upazila, its member and local Jubo Dal leader Md Nazir Hossain, BNP leader Nurul Islam 45, chairman of Dharmajoin UP in Biral upazila, Jamaat leaders Tazibur Rahman, 50, and Dr Younus Ali, 48,

of Dinajpur Sadar upazila. Thirty-three of the charge-sheeted accused have been arrested so far and attempts are on to arrest the rest, police said.

In the afternoon on January 5 last year, Jamaat-Shibir and BNP men attacked the Hindus at Kornai village in Dinajpur Sadar upazila.

Their 34 shops and two houses were torched and several others were looted and damaged, affecting 86 families, according to a list prepared by Dinajpur

Sadar upazila parishad. Later BGB of Dinajpur 2 Battalion repaired the damaged houses.

The affected people alleged that they had come under attack for casting votes in the parliament election.

Fearing further attacks, two Hindu families left the country after the incident, said locals.

After the attack, two cases were filed with Dinajpur Kotwali Police Station and the home ministry referred those to the CID in Dinajpur.

KILLING OF SCHOOLBOY FOR RANSOM

Three kidnappers to walk gallows in Cox's Bazar

A court here yesterday sentenced three people to death for killing a schoolboy after abduction in 2013.

The death penalty awardees are Myanmar nationals Abdul Khaleque, son of Mohammad Shafi, and Abdus Shukkur, son of Golam Bari, who used to stay illegally in the town for long, and Bahadur Mian, son of Siraj Mian of Chandanaish upazila in Chittagong district.

District and Session's Judge Sadiqul Islam Talukder also acquitted another accused named Jasim Uddin as charges



Victim Hridoy brought against him could not be proved.

According to the prosecution, the three abducted Hridoy, a student of nursery class, and son of Nurul Haque of Uttar Nurirchara area in the town, while he was returning home from school on

July 4, 2013.

The kidnappers then phoned Hridoy's elder brother Md Yusuf, demanding Tk 3 lakh for his release.

On the following day, police recovered Hridoy's body from Kalatali Road area. Later, Victim's father filed a murder case with Cox's Bazar Model Police Station.

The law enforcers then arrested four people in connection with the murder.

Police pressed charges against the four in 2014. After examining witnesses and evidence, the judge found the three guilty and pronounced the verdict.

Union declared free from child marriage

Harati union under Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila has been declared free from child marriage.

This was announced at a meeting held on the premises of the union parishad office yesterday. Lalmonirhat Deputy Commissioner (DC) Habibur Rahman, Superintendent of Police (SP) TM Mozahidul Islam, Sadar Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Shafiqul Islam, and Harati Union Parishad (UP) chairman Sirajul Islam were present in the meeting, which was jointly arranged by two NGOs.

It was declared that no child marriage would be held in Harati from now,

and stern action would be taken against anyone found guilty of arranging child marriage. The UP chairman and members, village police (gram police) and local elite will remain alert to prevent child marriage.

The DC said child marriage is a curse and a source of a family's discontentment. It has a bad impact on population growth and women's health in the society, and also causes untimely death of women.

Everybody should unite for removing the curse of child marriage for building a peaceful society, the SP said.

People from different villages of Harati union took an oath to prevent child marriage.

Schoolgirl raped in Bandarban

A schoolgirl was raped allegedly by her neighbour in Bhangamura area under Sadar upazila of Bandarban district on Saturday.

The accused is Shahab Uddin, 25, son of late Shamsu of the area, reports our correspondent.

The victim's mother said Shahab used to stalk her daughter, a student of Class IX, for the last few days.

He violated her when she went to take a bath in a pond in the area at 2:20pm, she alleged.

The girl was sent to Bandarban Sadar Hospital for medical test, said police.

A case was filed under Women and Children Repression Prevention Act, said Imtiaz Ahmed, officer-in-charge of Sadar Police Station.

Shahab went into hiding soon after filing of the case, said the OC.

"Shahab continued threatening us with death to withdraw the case," said the girl's mother.

In Lalmonirhat, police arrested a youth on charge of stalking a schoolgirl at Bhatbari village in Sadar upazila yesterday.

The arrestee is Shamim Hossain, 35, son of Akbar Ali of Bhatbari Kakeyadoba village, reports our correspondent.

Police and locals said Shamim used to tease the girl on her way to school.

Locals caught him red-handed while he was stalking the girl yesterday noon and handed him over to police, said Mahfuzur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Sadar Police Station.

Rice mill worker killed in boiler blast

A man was killed and two others were injured in a boiler explosion at a rice mill in Trimohony area under Naldanga upazila of the district yesterday morning.

The deceased was identified as Jahurul Islam, 35, son of Elahi Boksh of Panchani village in the upazila.

Witnesses said the boiler blasted with a big bang at Abu Hena Rice Mill in the area, leaving Jahurul, a worker of the mill, dead and two other workers injured.

Wazed Ali, officer-in-charge of Naldanga Police Station, said the injured, Shamsur Ali and Abdul Mannan, were admitted to Natore Sadar Hospital.

Bring college boy Al-Amin's killers to book

Demand Tangail townspeople at rally, human chain

Locals, relatives and fellow students took out a procession in the town yesterday, demanding immediate arrest and punishment of those who killed college student Al-Amin.

Al-Amin, 20, son of Ketab Ali of Char Patuli area and second-year student of Computer Engineering at Haji Abul Hossain Institute of Technology in the town, was beaten up mercilessly by a gang of extortionists of Majhipara area on May 22, as he failed to satisfy them.

He succumbed to his injuries at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) on May 26.

Victim's father lodged a

murder case with Tangail Model Police Station on May 28, accusing seven named and three unnamed people.

The identified accused are, Faruk, Sumon Mia, Michael Sumon, Al-Amin, Koyel, Sharif and Shakil.

Hundreds of townspeople joined the procession and paraded the main streets of the town. They later formed a human chain at Nirala Intersection.

Addressing a rally at the venue, the speakers threatened to launch a tougher agitation programme if the killers were not arrested immediately.

Among others, Al-Amin's father Ketab Ali, Tangail Press Club General Secretary Zafar Ahmed and

Councillor of Ward no 11 Salahuddin Haider addressed the rally.

On May 22, a gang picked up Al-Amin from near his house while he was playing cricket around 5:00pm. The gang took Al-Amin near a rice mill at Majhipara and thrashed him with a hammer, leaving him critically injured.

Hearing screams, locals rushed to the spot, rescued Al-Amin and took him to Tangail Medical College Hospital. On May 26, he was shifted to DMCH where he died the same night.

Contacted, Mustafizur Rahman, officer-in-charge (Investigation) of Tangail Model Police Station, said they are conducting drives to arrest the accused.

Lightning kills three in Sylhet, Sunamganj

Three people were killed by lightning in Sylhet and Sunamganj districts on Saturday.

In Sylhet, a man was killed by lightning at Noagaon village in Osmaninagar upazila of the district. The deceased is Azam Ali, 50, son of Haris Ullah of the village.

Police said a thunderbolt hit Azam while he was working at a cropland near his house around 6:30pm.

Away in Sunamganj, two children were

killed by lightning in Sadar and Dharmapasha upazila of the district the same day.

The victims are Afzal Mia, 12, son of Ayub Ali of Rupabali village in Jamalganj upazila, and Phulmati Begum, 8, of Tepikona village in Dharmapasha upazila.

Police said Afzal, a Class VI student of Rupabali Government Primary School, was struck by lightning in Dhopakhalia area in the town around 7:30pm. He died instantly.

A thunderbolt hit Phulmati while she was playing in the yard around 7:00pm.
