# Pay more for air travel

Tk 200-500 rise in tax per ticket

Air travellers now will have

to pay more as the government has hiked the excise tax on their tickets. The tax has been

increased by between Tk 200 and Tk 500, which would vary depending on routes. The new tax rate has been in force since June 6, according to a Statutory Regulatory Order issued by the National Board of Revenue recently.

For domestic routes, the tax on each ticket rose to Tk 500 from Tk 300.

There has been a Tk 200 tax-hike on tickets to Saarc countries as well.

On tickets to Asian countries (apart from the Saarc nations), the tax has been hiked to Tk 1,000 SEE PAGE 10 COL 3

# WB ready with \$1b funding

Wants to see Bangladesh as centre of region's connectivity

The World Bank could lend more than \$1 billion to implement a number of regional connectivity projects for boosting trade and investment among Bangladesh, India, Nepal and Bhutan.

A transport team of the global lender presented its detailed plan to bankroll the connectivity projects to Finance Minister AMA Muhith at the WB headquarters in Washington in April.

"By promoting the regional integration, Bangladesh can become the central hub in the region providing connectivity to the neighbouring countries," said the presentation.

Besides, a WB team visited several ports, customs points and India-Bangladesh multimodal corridors this year and last year. Following the visits, the team sent an aid memoir to the finance ministry, ministry officials told The Daily Star recently.

# Trafficking through Nepal surfaced

One man responsible for turning 52 Bhola families broke

At least 52 families in Bhola's Charfashion are now broke because of one broker of an international human trafficking gang.

Broker Faruque Hossain, a resident of Charfashion's Uttar Mangal village, had promised them jobs in Singapore, Canada and Sweden to rob them off everything. Each victim paid Faruque, now arrested,

between Tk 5 lakh and Tk 8 lakh in phases since 2012.

Of the victims, 23 men are from Uttar Mangal while eight, 10, five and six are from Anjur Hat, Char Kalmi, Awazpur and

Dhalchar, police records say. According to The Daily Star investiga-

tion, an estimated 2.5 lakh people from about 40 districts were lured into perilous sea voyages to Malaysia in the last eight years.
