Lawmaker's son admits opening fire

Say detectives about April 14 shooting at Eskaton

Bakhtiar Alam Rony, son of ruling party lawmaker Pinu Khan, has admitted opening fire on people at the capital's New Eskaton in the early hours of April 14.

A CNG-run autorickshaw driver and a rickshaw puller were killed in the firing, detectives say.

"Caught in the nagging traffic gridlock, I was feeling suffocated inside my SUV. At one point, I pushed down the window glass and fired four to five times from a licensed pistol," a DB officer yesterday quoted Bakhtiar as saying SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

Indian troops strike militants inside Myanmar

Indian press claims dozens killed; officials deny report

India's army attacked separatist rebels just over the border with Myanmar on Tuesday, a rare cross-border strike that both governments denied, showing New Delhi's resolve to fight terrorism beyond the country's borders.

The raid on two groups of militants was carried out in retaliation for the killing of 20 soldiers in an ambush in the northeastern state of Manipur last week, the heaviest losses for security forces in Manipur in two decades, Reuters reports.

The mountainous northeast which borders China, Bhutan,

Bangladesh and Myanmar, is home to dozens of insurgent groups fighting for autonomy or secession from India. For decades, soldiers have been deployed in the region but they are not known to have crossed borders even though

the military says rebels have sanctuaries in the region. The army said in a statement it had received intelligence

SC may start hearing appeal by the war crimes convict on June 16

The Supreme Court is now set to hear and settle the appeal of war criminal and BNP leader Salauddin Quader Chowdhury and it could start as soon as June 16 and be done with this year.

On October 1, 2013, the International Crimes Tribunal-1 found Salauddin guilty of nine out of 23 charges pressed against him for crimes against humanity and

genocide committed during the Liberation War.

The tribunal sentenced him to death on four charges, 20 years in jail on three charges and five years in jail on two other charges.

Salauddin was then the only incumbent member of parliament to have been convicted of war crimes and condemned. The BNP leader on October 29,

2013, appealed to the SC against the verdict SEE PAGE 10 COL 4

CONTEMPT OF COURT Zafrullah serves one-hour jail sentence

The International Crimes Tribunal-2 yesterday found Gonoshastha ya Kendra founder

Zafrullah Chowdhury guilty of contempt of court and gave him one-hour jail sentence in the dock for criticising the punishment of Dhaka-based British journalist David Bergman by the same court.

The three-member tribunal led by Justice Obaidul Hassan with members Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah and Justice Md Shahinur Islam also fined Zafrullah Tk 5000, payable in seven days. In default, he will have to spend a month in jail. The court observed


