Police yesterday arrested "two killers" in the capital and recovered the skeleton of a 14-year-old boy, who had gone missing four months ago, from an abandoned toilet in Gabtoli following their information.

The boy, Abul Bashar, had been brought to Gabtoli sweeper colony by his nephew Rabiul Islam from Patuakhali for a job, his family told police, who arrested Rabiul's friends Shahidul Islam and Rocky in Gabtoli. They told police that they and Rabiul stabbed Abdul to death in February to take revenge against the Bashar family as Rabiul had believed that the family caused his parents' divorce. # Bangladeshi found dead in Maldives

Cops term it murder

An undocumented Bangladeshi migrant was found dead with severe head injuries at an uninhabited house in Laamu Atoll Gan Island of the Maldives yesterday, reports Minivan News.

Ishag Yoosuf, 65, caretaker of the house, said he discovered the body of farm worker known as Bassan, 30, who had been working in the Maldives for 10 years.

Bassan's face was covered with a bloodstained pillow, he said, adding that blood splattered all over the walls up to eight feet.

"He (Bassan) told me he had asked the owner who is living in Malé if he could sleep in the house," Ishag said.

House owner Thoha Waheed, however, denied that Bassan sought the permission.

Calling it a murder, police said investigation was going on. This is the third apparent murder of Bangladeshis this year. The Human Rights Commission of the Maldives expressed concern over the country's failure in protecting

migrant workers. Around 80,000 of total 1.24 lakh migrant workers in the Maldives are Bangladeshis. Some 30,000 are undocumented.

## AUW starts course on mental health

The Asian University for Women (AUW) in Chittagong has launched a special summer course on Global Mental Health for its undergraduate students studying liberal arts and sciences.

The five-week course focuses on historical treatment of mental illness, mental health in local and global cultural contexts, positive psychology, effect of violence on mental health, and integration of maternal and child health with mental health care delivery.

Thirty students from different Asian countries have enrolled for the course which is being taught by visiting faculty members from Harvard Medical School, Yale School of Medicine, National University of Singapore, and London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, and one of AUW's resident faculty members.

The course, initiated by Saima Wazed Hossain, member of World Health Organization's Expert Advisory Panel on Mental Health and also daughter of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, was designed by a committee chaired by Prof Arthur Kleinman, the Esther and Sidney Rabb Professor, Department of Anthropology, Harvard University and professor of Medical Anthropology in Global Health and Social Medicine and professor of Psychiatry, Harvard Medical School.

Harvard University Asia Center, Harvard South Asia Institute, and Ladd Family Foundation have given grants for the course.
