

Flood situation in Gaibandha, Bogra remains unchanged

Erosion by the Jamuna River took a serious turn in Chowhali upazila of Sirajganj district in the last seven days, devouring over 500 homesteads, reports our Pabna correspondent.

A bridge at Brac intersection in Khaskaunia union collapsed due to unusual pressure of water on Monday afternoon, said Md Rafikul Islam alias Gani Mollah, chairman of the union parishad, adding that over 100 houses were eroded by the river on the day.

At least 10 educational institutions went into the river while 20 others face erosion threat, said Upazila Nirbahi Officer Md Rezaul Members of Border Guard

Despite repeated pleas, Water Development Board (WDB) authorities are yet to take any remarkable steps to check the erosion, said Abdul Latif, a resident of

Khaskaunia village.

Contacted, the UNO said they have already informed the authorities concerned about the matter. Meanwhile, the flood




