A Jubo League man was stabbed to death at Mandra Khal of Khulna yesterday.

Victim, Imran Sajib Akando, 28, of Gollamari area, was an activist of ward-6 of Jolma union Jubo League.

Police said about 10 to 20 armed miscreants stabbed Imran at noon. He was declared dead at Khulna Medical College Hospital. Police said Imran was wanted in several cases, including murder.

REVIEW OF SC'S VERDICT Lawyers to meet

Mojaheed today for instructions

Five lawyers of convicted war criminal Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed will meet him at Dhaka Central Jail today for instructions regarding seeking a review of the Supreme Court verdict that upheld his death penalty.

Contacted, his lawyer Shishir Manir said they will seek necessary information from the Jamaat secretary general about filing a review petition with the SC against its verdict depending on the situation at the jail.

On June 16, the Appellate Division of the SC upheld the death penalty of Mojaheed for planning and instigating the killing of intellectuals and professionals in 1971. During the war, he was chief of infamous Al-Badr Bahini, one of the Pakistani occupation army's auxiliary forces, responsible for abducting, torturing and killing freedom fighters, intellectuals and pro-liberation people.

This is the first time that an ex-minister has been sentenced to death by the SC for war crimes. Mojaheed is also the first war crimes convict facing death for the killing of intellectuals and professionals. Mojaheed can now file a review petition and if rejected, seek presidential clemency as a last option to save his life.

Wrong-way Ctg human haulers threatening lives

Around 100 three-wheeler human haulers, locally called tempo, are driving down the wrong way along a busy Chittagong city road every morning risking accidents and allegedly bribing traffic police to turn a blind eye.

On June 10, a garment worker was killed and another two passengers were injured after one of the vehicles was hit by a covered van on the road, around four kilometres in length stretching from Saltgola to the EPZ intersection.

Locals say smaller accidents were a regular phenomenon for a large number of workers pass the road during the two-hour period from 6:00am. One worker, Rekha Begum, recently

told The Daily Star, "These vehicles often push and brush against pedestrians...and move dangerously." It is worrying keeping an eye on both ways for vehicles, said another, Pizush Chakma.

A covered van driver, Mohammed Emran, said the vehicles often block

the road creating a gridlock.

The vehicle drivers say they usually ply on the Barek Building to Chawkbazar intersection route, for which they have permits, but have been running on the illegal route for the past one year to make some extra cash.

Each vehicle bribes traffic police Tk 20 to 30 every day, they claimed.

Chittagong Metropolitan Police Deputy Commissioner Traffic (Port) Sujayet Islam said he was unaware of the malpractice and bribes. He assured taking immediate steps.

the supply from alternative sources.

He suggested that the community people raise funds by themselves for infrastructure development. If the initiative fails, local representatives may assist, he said, adding that if it too did not work, then the upazila parishad would intervene.

A platform for raising awareness among the local community about the clinic services and organising interactions with officials has been created by World Vision Bangladesh, an international humanitarian body. The organisation is also working in Fulbaria upazila the same way.

According to locals, the practice has

improved healthcare services in their areas. "Earlier, we did not get the doctors (healthcare providers) in the clinic most of the time and it closed after Zohr prayers. But now we have them till 3:00pm," said Rafiqul Islam, who came to Teligram Community

Clinic at Fulbaria last week. There are 39 clinics in Muktagachha and

46 in Fulbaria. At Montala Community Clinic of Muktagachha, service-seeker Ramisa Begum said, "Earlier, we did not get medicines here, but now we get those for minor diseases like fever, cold, headache." There are over
