: ALERT roundtable urges govt

 Legal experts and civil society mem-: bers at a roundtable yesterday · demanded an all-out drive to arrest and punish human traffickers, irrespective of the strings they pull, to uproot the slave trade menace.

Bangladesh has to first take : action against those based locally and establish bilateral and regional · collaboration, including intelligence sharing, to root out the international trafficking networks, they said.

"It is surprising how lakhs of people have been trafficked for long · through the Bay of Bengal despite active presence of law enforcers -border guards, coast guards and SEE PAGE 4 COL 4 · navy," said Jahangir Alam Khan,

chair of ALERT.

The Association for Law Research & Human Rights (ALERT) organised the roundtable on "ways to prevent human trafficking in the light of the spirit of Liberation War" in the capital's Jatiya Press Club. Following the discovery of mass

graves in Thailand, some 5,000 victims, Rohingyas facing persecution in Myanmar and Bangladeshis seeking jobs, have been rescued in Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Myanmar since late April.

"We know that many influential people, including a parliament member and a Teknaf panel mayor, are on the government list of suspected human traffickers, but they are out of the government's reach,"

Ramadan starts in port city amid water crisis

Repeated complaints over several weeks failed to move Wasa, allege residents

An acute water crisis has been prevailing in Chittagong city for several weeks due to a fall in production by the Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa)

Sufferings of the city dwellers have persisted with the beginning of the month of Ramadan.

Some locals alleged Chittagong Wasa is sending them bills but it is not supplying

Despite repeated complaints from the residents about the matter, Wasa is not paying heed to them, they further alleged. The situation is worse in Sholakbahar Residential Area, Alkaran, Halishahar, Hemsen Lane, Pathantuli, Dhaniyalapara,

Motijharna, Panchlaish, Nasirabad, Battery Goli, Patenga and Chawk Bazar. "We are suffering a lot in the month of Ramadan. Now I am buying a jar of water at Tk 60 to Tk 100 every day," Md Zulfiquar of

Sholakbahar told The Daily Star. For washing clothes, their domestic help has to go to their relative's house, he added.

lor living in Alkaran, said he did not get even a drop of water in the last two months but he

received bills from Wasa. Madina Begum, a garment worker of Battery Goli, said she did not get water from a pump of Wasa in the area although she had to wait in a long queue for a long time on Friday night.

Some Wasa officials said the production had fallen due to fast depletion of groundwater.

Wasa now produces 21 crore litres of water per day against the demand of 50 crore litres, they said.

Currently, a total of 9 crore litres of water from the river Halda is being supplied to the city dwellers via Mohara water treatment plant while the remaining 12 crore is being extracted from underground through pumps, the Wasa sources said.

AKM Fazlullah, managing director of Wasa, said the water crisis of the city would be reduced by the next year after completion of the construction of a water treatment plant with a capacity of producing 14 crore litres per day at Pomra in Rangunia upazila under Karnaphuli Water Supply Project.

A woman yesterday filed a complaint with police alleging that she was raped by a man while his cohorts recorded the incident with a video camera in the capi-


tal's Shewrapara. Police detained five people including the alleged rapist after the woman filed the case with Mirpur Police Station, said Sub-inspector
