Chile power into quarterfinals



Neymar was dramatically thrown out of the Copa America on Friday as Chile shrugged off the drunk-driving controversy surrounding Arturo Vidal to power into the

quarterfinals. Neymar's participation in the South American footballing showpiece came to an abrupt end after a disciplinary hearing slapped him with a fourmatch ban for headbutting a

Colombian opponent. The punishment deprives the tournament of one of its most recognizable stars and leaves Brazil in turmoil as it contemplates the remainder of the tournament without their captain and

best player. Neymar's fate had been in the balance after he was given a red card for headbutting an opponent during a post-match brawl that erupted after Brazil's 1-0 upset loss to Colombia in Group C on Wednesday.

The 23-year-old superstar was already ruled out of Brazil's final group game against Venezuela on Sunday after collecting a second yellow card of the tournament against the Colombians.

Neymar, who was also fined \$10,000, can appeal the punishment. But unless the ban is reduced it means he has played his last game of the Copa, with Brazil having at most four games left.

Alberto Lozada, a member of the disciplinary committee, revealed

Neymar had received a heavier punishment because he had abused match officials in the tunnel following his dismissal.

"Worst of all was that after the job of Bolivia. match he waited for the referee in the tunnel and insulted him, which aggravated the matter and led to the longer ban," Lozada told Brazilian media.

Colombian player Carlos Bacca, who shoved Neymar following his butt on goal scorer Jeison Murillo, was

suspended for two games. On the pitch Friday, hosts Chile, rocked by the arrest for drunk-driving

of star midfielder Vidal earlier in the week, turned on the style to ensure qualification for the quarterfinals as group winners with a 5-0 demolition

Both Chile and Bolivia had already been assured of a place in the last eight after Ecuador's 2-1 victory over Mexico earlier in the day.

Goals from Charles Aranguiz (2), Alexis Sanchez, Gary Medel and an own goal from Bolivia captain Ronald Raldes completed a one-sided rout for the hosts, who now face a quarter-final in Santiago next Wednesday against the best ranked third placed team from the first phase, most likely to be either Uruguay or Paraguay.

The Chileans, who included Vidal in their starting line-up, swept into an early lead after only three minutes with a well-worked goal from Aranguiz.

Inter Milan defender Medel pumped a long ball forward, and Eduardo Vargas knocked down it into the path of Aranguiz, who drilled a low shot beyond Bolivia goalkeeper Romel Quinonez.

English Premier League star Sanchez made it 2-0 with a superb low header on 37 minutes to leave Chile in control at half-time.

Aranguiz grabbed his second of the evening at 66 minutes, finishing off a low cross from Angelo Henriquez.

Medel made it 4-0 with a superb individual effort in the 80th minute, playing a one-two with Jorge Valdivia, controlling on his chest and then lifting a chipped finish over Quinonez.

Bolivia's misery was complete when skipper Raldes chipped his goalkeeper for a freak own goal to make it 5-0.

AFC U-19 CHAMPIONSHIP BD eye final round

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is planning to start the under-19 camp in Dhaka within a week in a bid to qualifying for the final round of the 2016 AFC U-19 Championship, which will be hosted by

Bahrain.

A total of 43 teams have been split into ten qualifying groups, with Bangladesh pitted in Group A alongside Uzbekistan, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bhutan. The ten group champions and five best runners-up teams will join hosts Bahrain in the championship proper. The qualification round for Group A will take place in Sri Lanka from September 28. Since only Uzbekistan are above Bangladesh according

to the senior men's FIFA rankings, the game's governing body feels this is a good opportunity for Bangladesh to qualify for the final round. It has been learnt that the camp will start under the

observation of coach Saiful Bari Titu with around 40 to 45 players who will be selected from the Sylhet BKSP academy and also from the pioneer league. The size of the camp will then be trimmed to 30 within a week of its commencement.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh will host the Qualifiers of AFC Under-16 Championship in September where they will play against Saudi Arabia, UAE and Pakistan in Group D. The preparation camp for that championship is expected to begin from the start of July with players selected from the ongoing national under-15 championship.

Hamilton takes 45th pole

The 2013 Wimbledon champion has become friendly with Mourinho since using Chelsea's training ground, which is near his Cobham home, during his recovery from back

surgery last year. And given Mourinho's vast success, including leading Chelsea to the Premier League title and League Cup last season, it is little surprise that Murray is keen to get a few tips from the Portuguese coach.

"I haven't met him long enough or in a situation where I could do that," Murray said.

"But I'd love to chat to him about those things to understand what it is that makes him great.'

England take series 3-2

Jonny Bairstow proved the ideal stand-in as he guided England to a series-clinching win over New Zealand in the fifth one-day international at the Riverside on Saturday.

Bairstow, only playing after first-choice wicket-keeper Jos Buttler was injured on Friday, made 83 not out as England, chasing a revised target of 192 in 26 overs, finished on 192 for seven with six balls to spare.

England's three-wicket win under the Duckworth/Lewis method saw them clinch the five-match series 3-2.

They had been in dire straits at 45 for five before a stand of 80 between Bairstow and Sam Billings (41) revived their victory hopes.

Adil Rashid finished 12 not out, having helped Yorkshire team-mate Bairstow add an unbroken 54 for the eighth wicket.

Earlier, New Zealand made 383 for nine in their full 50 overs after losing the toss. Martin Guptill top-scored with 67, Kane Williamson

made exactly 50 and Ben Wheeler bolstered the total with a

quickfire 39 not out. All-rounder Ben Stokes took three for 52 on his Durham home ground and leg-spinner Rashid two for 45.

After rain delayed the start, England captain Eoin Morgan saw his decision to field first rewarded with a wicket in the first over.

New Zealand captain Brendon McCullum, one ball after lofting Finn for six, played on to Morgan's Middlesex teammate.
